

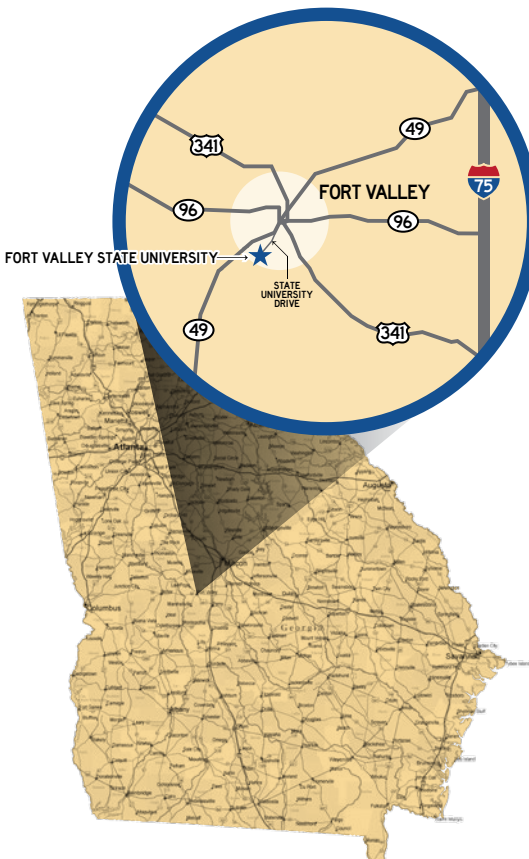

Program Overview

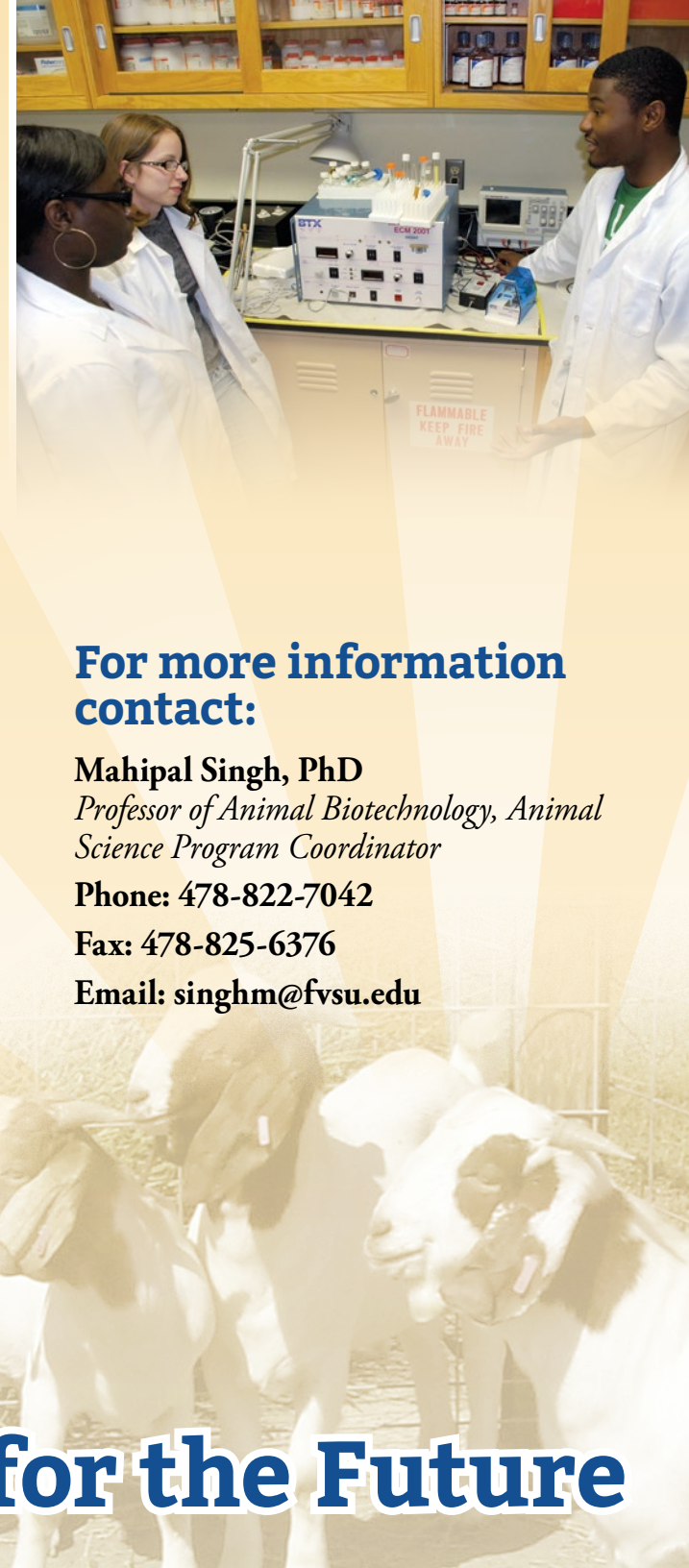
Graduates of the Animal Science program will be well prepared to pursue higher studies in animal nutrition, physiology, molecular biology, food science and health sciences. They are also equipped

to become employed in private or government agencies involved in animal production or processing, or in the distribution and utilization of animal products.

Program Requirements

Approximately 125 semester credit hours are required to complete the program, 31 of which are in animal science. These include molecular biology, basic and applied nutrition, animal genetics, animal physiology, animal ethology, research methodologies, food microbiology, meat science, food engineering and food preservation.

Requirements for program admission are the following: 2.25 GPA on a 4.0 scale, SAT-430 Critical Thinking/Verbal and 400 Math or ACT-17 English and 17 Math.
