*** Tuition Rates:**
(Only for freshman students entering Fall Semester 2008)

The **guaranteed tuition rate** per credit hour for freshman students entering Fall 2008 in-state is \$130.00. The per semester guaranteed tuition rate for in-state freshman students entering Fall 2008 enrolled in 12 or more credit hours is \$1,549.00. The **guaranteed tuition rate** per credit hour for out-of-state is \$517.00. The per semester guaranteed tuition rate for an out-of-state freshman student entering Fall 2008 enrolled in 12 or more credit hours is \$6,195.00.

Student Technology Fee:

The technology fee is a mandatory fee charged to all students. This fee is charged to support the cost of a 24-hour student computer lab located on campus, off-campus lab(s) or computer access, help desk services, supplies, card access to lab and other student supported technology services.

Mandatory Fees (other):

All other mandatory fees (excluding the technology fee) are charged to each student enrolled in **four (4) or more** credit hours. These mandatory fees are paid each semester and support the activities and programs listed below. If students are enrolled in Weekend-College or Off-Campus courses **only**, mandatory fees (other) are not required.

- Student Center/ Multi Use Fee (New):

Per semester fee; supports the financing of the new Multi-Use Student Center/Stadium. This facility will provide recreational, social, and study areas for students enrolled at the University.

- Student Health Fee:

Per semester fee; supports on campus health education and infirmary services for students.

- Student Activity Fee:

Per semester fee; the allocation of these funds is determined by a student committee. Designations include things like intramural sports, speakers, student organizations, publications, band and choir.

- Student Athletic Fee:

Per semester fee; supports the men's and women's varsity athletic programs including football, basketball, tennis, track and field, women's softball and volleyball.

**Note: Board of Regents Policy states that "All tuition and fees are due and payable upon registration".
Personal deferments of tuition and fees are not allowed.**

It is University policy to accept only authorized checks drawn on Georgia banks. All payments must be in either cash, money order, cashier's check, certified check, personal check, VISA or MasterCard. Arrangements for wiring funds to the University should be made with the Cashier's Office at 478-825-6433 or via email to ecashier@fvsu.edu. Online Payments can be completed via the student's Banner Web account at www.fvsu.edu using either VISA, MasterCard, or a personal checking or savings account. ALWAYS INCLUDE THE STUDENT'S NAME AND STUDENT ID NUMBER ON THE CHECK. MAKE CHECKS PAYABLE TO FORT VALLEY STATE UNIVERSITY.

ANY STUDENT WHOSE ACCOUNT IS PAID WITH AN NSF CHECK WILL BE CHARGED A \$25.00 FEE, HIS/HER REGISTRATION WILL BE CANCELED AND THE STUDENT WILL LOSE FUTURE CHECK PRIVILEGES FOR UP TO A YEAR OR MORE.

**THE LATE REGISTRATION FEE IS \$35.00 THE FIRST DAY AND AN ADDITIONAL \$10 PER DAY THEREAFTER NOT TO EXCEED \$65.00

The 7-Meal Plan is the **minimum requirement** for juniors and seniors in Buildings 200 & 300 of the Wildcat Commons. The 15-Meal Plan is also available to freshman and sophomores of the Wildcat Commons and students living in the traditional residence halls, upon prior approval by the Vice President for Business and Finance. Students may be approved for the 15-Meal Plan for medical or employment reasons. **The Commuter Meal Plans are for commuting students only.**

Students in the following categories are **required** to have insurance under the Student Health Insurance Program. All graduate students with graduate assistantships receiving a full tuition waiver as part of their graduate assistantship award; all undergraduate, graduate and ESL international students holding F or J visas; all undergraduate and graduate students enrolled in programs that require proof of health insurance; and all graduate students receiving fellowships that fully fund their tuition.

FVSU REFUND POLICY

Regulations of the Board of Regents of the University System of Georgia provide for tuition and mandatory fee refunds when **formal withdrawal** from the institution is approved within a designated period following registration.

The refund percentage that a student receives is a calculation of the time remaining in the semester up through 60% of the semester. Once 60% of the semester has expired, there is no refund for a withdrawal from the institution. The refund calculation is based on days enrolled in the semester divided by the number of calendar days in the semester including weekends and holidays, but excluding breaks of five (5) or more consecutive days.

A refund of all semester tuition and other mandatory fees is made in the event of death of a student any time during an academic semester. (BR Minutes, 1979-80, p. 61; 1986-87, pp. 24-25; 1995, p. 246).

REFUNDS ARE NOT MADE FOR A REDUCTION IN CLASS LOAD AFTER THE FIRST DAY OF CLASSES.
