STEVIE BAGGS JR. is a three-time All-American linebacker/defensive-end, playing in both the NFL and CFL for teams including the Baltimore Ravens, Arizona Cardinals, Saskatchewan Roughriders, and Hamilton Tiger-Cats. Stevie Baggs Jr. earned his nickname, "Shakespeare," during his college football career by making plays on and off the field. He graduated in 2005 with a degree in International Business from Bethune Cookman University.

Drawing from his experience in professional sports and as an activist for human rights, Stevie Baggs Jr. has dedicated time in his career to empowering youth and adults as an impactful inspirational speaker. His driven attitude and gracious service to the community have gained him the support and partnership of many renowned charitable, educational, health, and sports organizations. Named Health and Wellness Ambassador for the City of Atlanta, Stevie continues to be a strong voice for the promotion of a healthy lifestyle.

Stevie can be spotted on television having worked alongside Barry Jenkins in the hit series "The Underground Railroad." He is also working alongside Tyler Perry in the hit show "Ruthless." You will also see him in Kobra Kai and in the currently airing television show, "The Game," on CBS and Paramount Plus. Stevie has appearances on The Steve Harvey Show, Wendy Williams, and The View. In addition to his acting career, Stevie is also very passionate about real estate investing. He believes that you can't change the culture without having agriculture.

As an advocate for change, Stevie Baggs Jr. works in communities to enhance the minds of youth to fuel the future through his CETA (Creating Empowerment Through Autonomy) foundation. The CETA Foundation, currently celebrating 18 years of service, envisions a world where all individuals have the health and wellness tools, resources, and support to maximize their quality of life.

Recognized as the only athlete to play for eleven professional teams in ten years, "Shakespeare" continues to inspire and make plays off the field. 

A True Wildcat, he leaves an indelible mark, inspiring countless students and donors, earning his place in the esteemed FVSU NAA Hall of Fame honoree.



MR. KENNETH HOWARD

Co-founder of Critter Fixer Veterinary Hospital, he's a dedicated veterinarian and TV star on Nat Geo Wild's "Critter Fixers: Country Vets." Beyond his busy schedule, Dr. Ferguson prioritizes community engagement, founding the Peach County Youth Association and running Football Skill Development. In 2022, he and his son launched the T-Fergg One Yard at a Time Foundation, promoting youth and adult fitness. Dr. Ferguson, a muscle car enthusiast and co-owner of Critter Fixer Cattle Company, finds joy in family time with his wife Kimberly, a social worker, and their two children, Terri Nicole and TJ.



MATTHEW MCRAE, DMD, M.A.G.D.

Dr. Matthew McRae Jr., a distinguished member of the class of 1970, boasts a remarkable legacy as a dental practitioner in Athens, GA, spanning over five decades. His commitment to excellence is exemplified by the establishment of three thriving dental practices in the Athens area. In 1973, Dr. McRae achieved a historic milestone by becoming the first Black graduate of the Dental School at the Medical College of Georgia, a significant accomplishment that recently earned him the honor of having his portrait displayed. Beyond his professional achievements, Dr. McRae is a dedicated supporter of Fort Valley State University (FVSU), contributing significantly to the betterment of students. His philanthropic endeavors include substantial contributions to the Jeddie Lee and Matthew McRae Sr. Family Scholarship, benefitting Math and Science students at FVSU, a testament to his enduring commitment to education and community.



FREDDIE MCRAE, MD

Dr. Freddie L. McRae, a distinguished graduate of Fort Valley State University's class of 1972, personifies a legacy of excellence and trailblazing achievements. Celebrating 52 years of marriage to his college sweetheart, Dr. Inez Holloway McRae, they proudly raised two daughters, Ms. Jeddie McRae and Frita McRae Fisher, MD, as well as a son, Mr. Freddie McRae Jr., and six grandchildren. A retired general and peripheral vascular surgeon, Dr. McRae graduated from the Medical College of Georgia in 1975, where he attained the highest honor for a medical student, induction into the A.O.A. Honor Medical Society. Dr. McRae's journey has been marked by consistent trailblazing, from graduating as valedictorian

of his high school to becoming the first Black surgeon in St. Petersburg, FL. A member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., Dr. McRae exemplifies the excellence fostered by Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCUs).




HONOREE AWARD RECIPIENTS



ARETHA HILL, PH.D.

Aretha Hill, CPA, Ph.D., is an Associate Professor of Accounting at Alabama Agricultural and Mechanical University where she previously served as the Associate Dean and MBA Director. Aretha also served as the Chair of the Department of Business Administration and Economics at FVSU and on the faculty at Florida A&M University and North Carolina A&T State University. Prior to her academic career, Aretha held positions with PWC, KPMG, and Ernst & Young international accounting firms. Aretha is a former AICPA National Accreditation Commissioner and member of the AICPA Academic Executive Committee. Aretha is a life member of Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated and the FVSU National Alumni Association.



MR. BERRY JORDAN, Posthumously

Berry Jordan, a distinguished graduate from the class of 1965, earned his BS degree in Social Science and went on to achieve an MS degree in Public Administration through a Ford Fellowship at Georgia State University. A member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., Sigma Pi Phi Fraternity, and a lifelong contributor to the FVSU National Alumni Association, Mr. Jordan's legacy is one of remarkable service and leadership. As the Equal Opportunity Director at Robins Air Force Base, he broke barriers as the sole minority on the Robins Air Logistics Center Commander's Staff. Passionate about community service, he chaired the Board of Directors for the Rainbow House, combating child abuse, and led Volunteer Houston County. Notably, Mr. Jordan presided over the Fort Valley Evening Optimist Club and the FVSU End Zoners Club, raising substantial funds for athletic programs. His commitment extended nationally, earning him the title of Kentucky Colonel from the Commonwealth of Kentucky for his exceptional service, and accolades such as the FVSU President's Trailblazers Award and the National Association for Equal Opportunity in Higher Education's President's Citation for his contributions to education.



MR. DENNIS HERBERT, Posthumously

Dennis Herbert, a lifelong Fort Valley resident, embodied a spirit of service and commitment from his early days as an Eagle Scout to his endeavors in music as a teen and adult. A proud Auburn University graduate, Dennis returned to his roots in Fort Valley, seamlessly integrating into the family business, Herbert Jewelers, alongside his parents. Dennis and his wife, Peggy, demonstrated unwavering dedication to Fort Valley and the Fort Valley State University Foundation. Invited by Ralph Malone in 1989, Dennis assumed the role of Foundation Treasurer for over 25 years. Ever accessible, he diligently signed checks, crafted plaques, and offered insightful suggestions for dignitary gifts, leaving an indelible mark on Fort Valley State University.



MR. LUTHER JONES

Luther Jones, a Lincolnton, Georgia native, stands as a distinguished alum of Fort Valley State University, graduating with a B.S. in Agriculture in 1982, followed by an M.S. in Agricultural Economics from the University of Illinois in 1984. 
