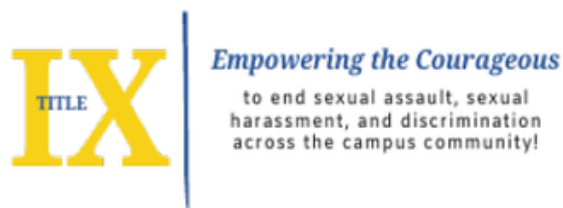

Anyone who has made a report or complaint, provided information, assisted, participated, or refused to participate in any manner in the Title IX process, shall not be subjected to retaliation.

If you believe you have been subject to retaliation, immediately contact the Title IX Coordinator.

Any person found engaging in retaliation in violation of the Title IX Policy will receive disciplinary action.

Supportive Services

Support services are non-disciplinary, nonpunitive, individualized services offered as appropriate, as reasonably available, and without charge that are made available to the Complainant and/or Respondent before or after the filing of a complainant or where no complaint has been filed.

Any enrolled student, faculty, or staff at FVSU may request supportive services.

Temporary Remedial Measures

Interim measures are designed to protect any student or other individual in the FVSU community.

Any enrolled student, faculty, or staff at FVSU may request temporary remedial measures.

What Should I Do If I Am Accused of Violating the Title IX Policy?

Remain calm and find support.

This may be an emotional and stressful situation. You may take advantage of the available resources on and off campus.

Educate yourself on how the Title IX process works.

Visit FVSU's Title IX website for more information on the Title IX policy and process. You may also contact the Title IX Coordinator if you have any questions, comments, or concerns.



Consider cooperation with the proper authorities.

Cooperating with FVSU officials in the investigation can help assist in the process of the case and yield fast results. Cooperation includes, but is not limited to, evidence gathering, interviews, etc.

Preserve all forms of evidence.

Do not destroy or tamper with any potential evidence. Both parties have the right to submit any relevant evidence during the investigation process.

Respondent Rights

A Respondent is a person accused of violating the Title IX Policy.

- A right to a notice detailing the sexual harassment/misconduct allegations, the name of the person who reported you, information pertaining to our Title IX Policy, and a list of support services offered.
- A right to be treated without discrimination and have the grievance and investigation process explained to you.
- A right to have an advisor of your choice support you in the process and assist you at the live hearing.
- A right to be free from retaliation
