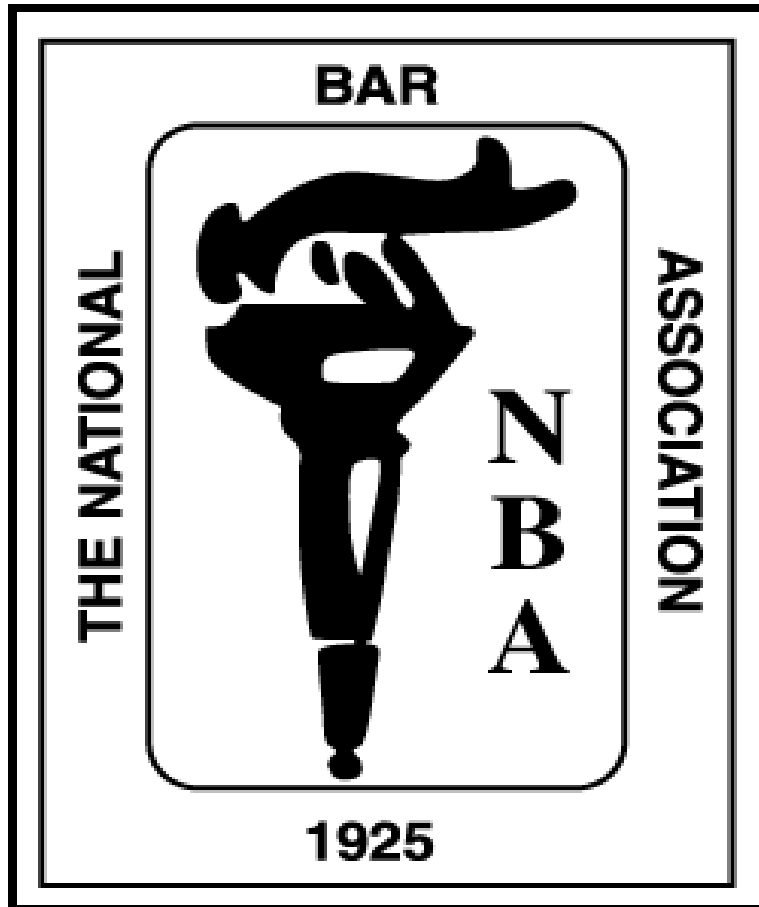

National Bar Association Corporate Law Section: Gateway to Success Scholarship Awards 2019

Scholarship Award Objectives

The “NBA Gateway to Success Scholarship Award” helps to fulfill the National Bar Association’s (“NBA”) mission of strengthening the pipeline for minority law students. Further, the award encourages involvement in the NBA through student support and collaboration. Additionally, this scholarship serves to facilitate and encourage minorities to enter the legal profession by assisting minority students to meet the challenges and financial burdens of college and law school. Therefore, the NBA has partnered with several minority organizations, including the National Black Law Students Association (NBLSA) to identify deserving candidates to receive the NBA Corporate Law Section Gateway to Success Scholarship Award (hereinafter “Scholarship Award”). This year there will be a total of six Scholarship Awards given to deserving African American applicants, including three undergraduate students who intend to apply and attend law school and three current law school students attending law school.

Scholarship Criteria and Eligibility

The Scholarships will be awarded nationally to six African American diverse students including two undergraduate students who intend to apply and attend law school and three current law school students attending law school in the following manner: 1) two scholarships to undergraduate students of any major **and** 2) three scholarships to current law school students. The scholarship recipients will be considered based on their economic need, involvement in the community and diversity related student organizations, leadership abilities and academic achievement. Selection criteria will include: financial need, merit, and scholastic performance. Consideration will also be given to extracurricular activities both inside and outside law school.
