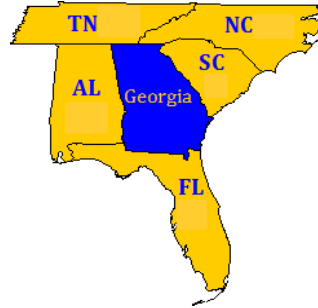

Figure 1: Fall 2019 Applications

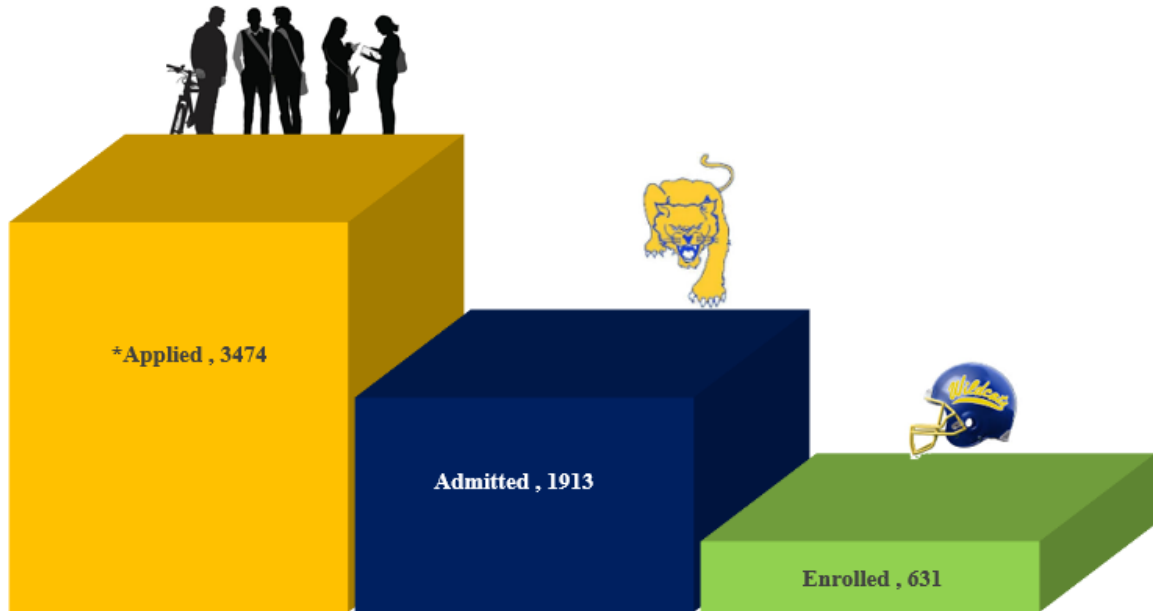
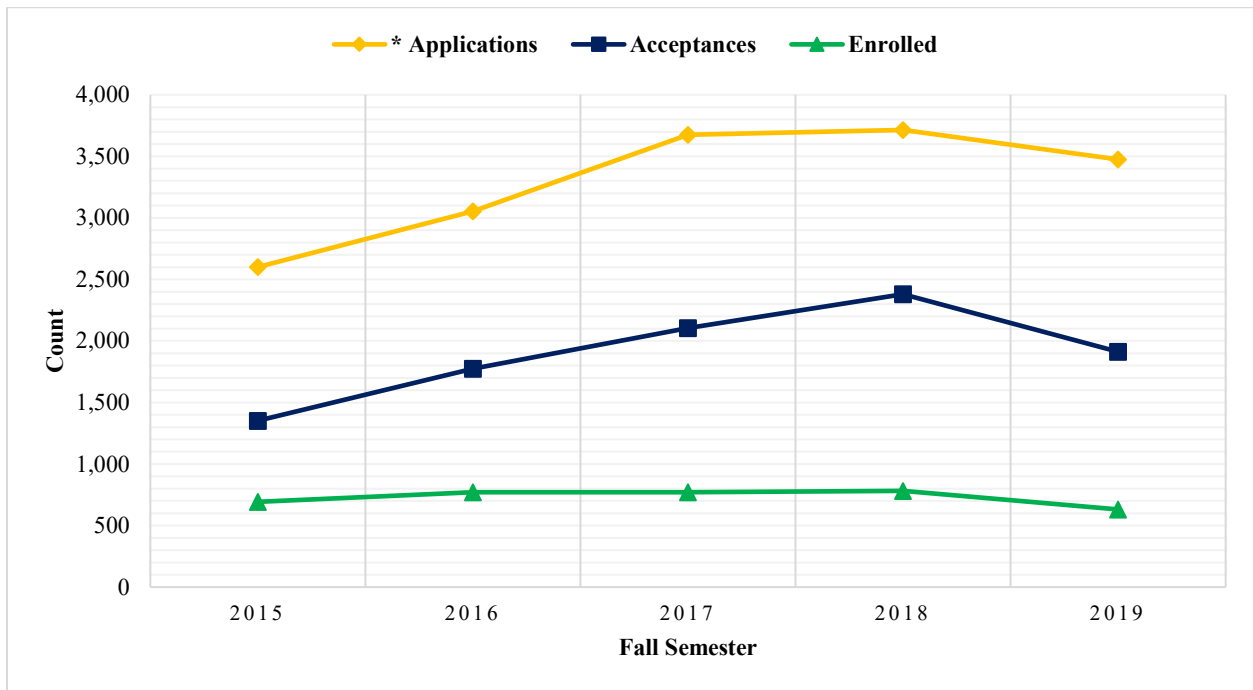

Figure 2: Fall 2015– Fall 2019 Applications, Acceptance Rate and Matriculation Rate



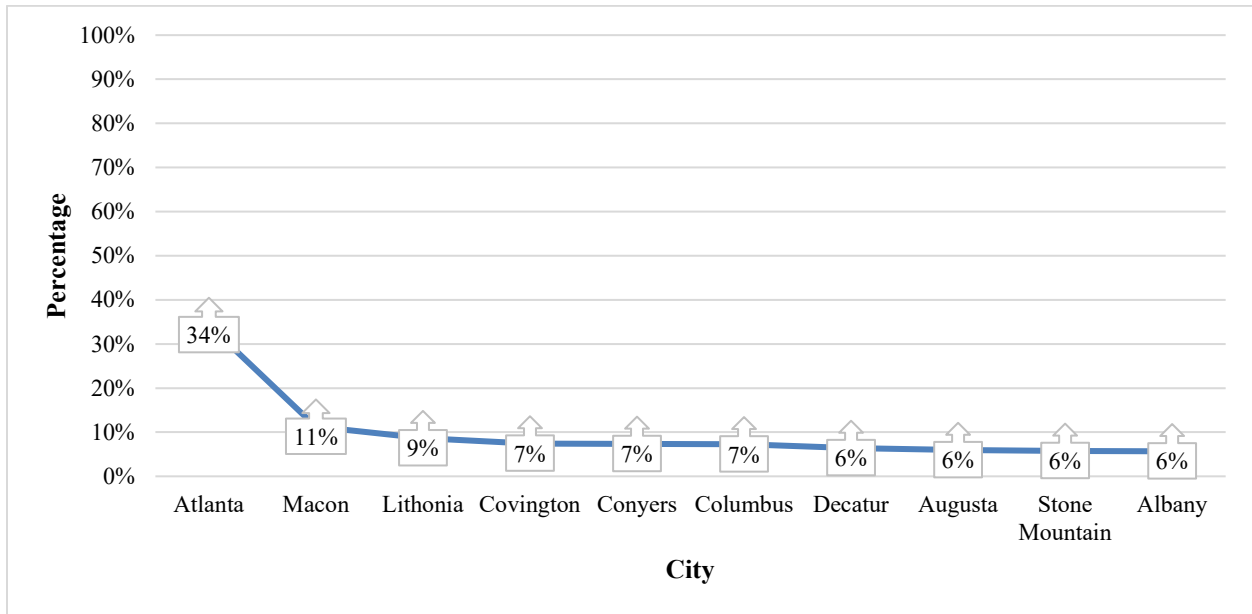

Figure 3: Fall 2019 Top 10 Cities by Applications

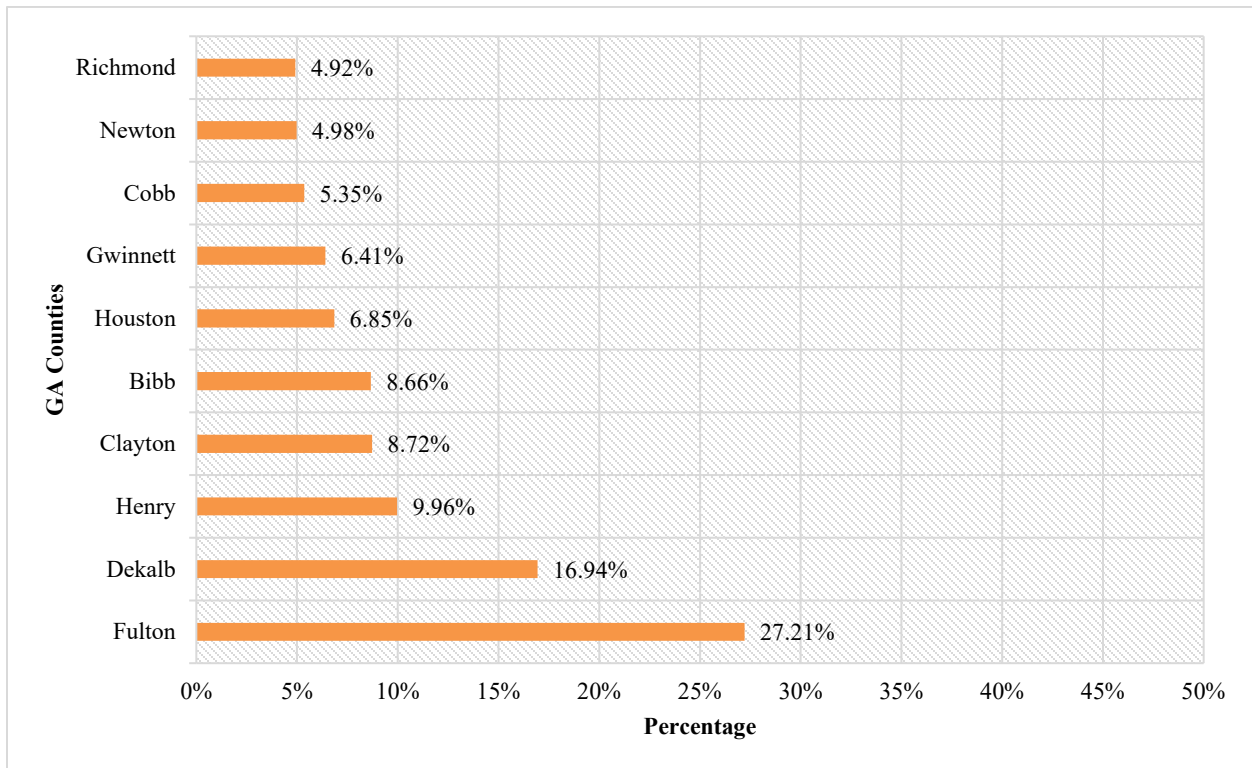

Figure 4: Fall 2019 Top 10 Counties by First Time Freshmen Applications.

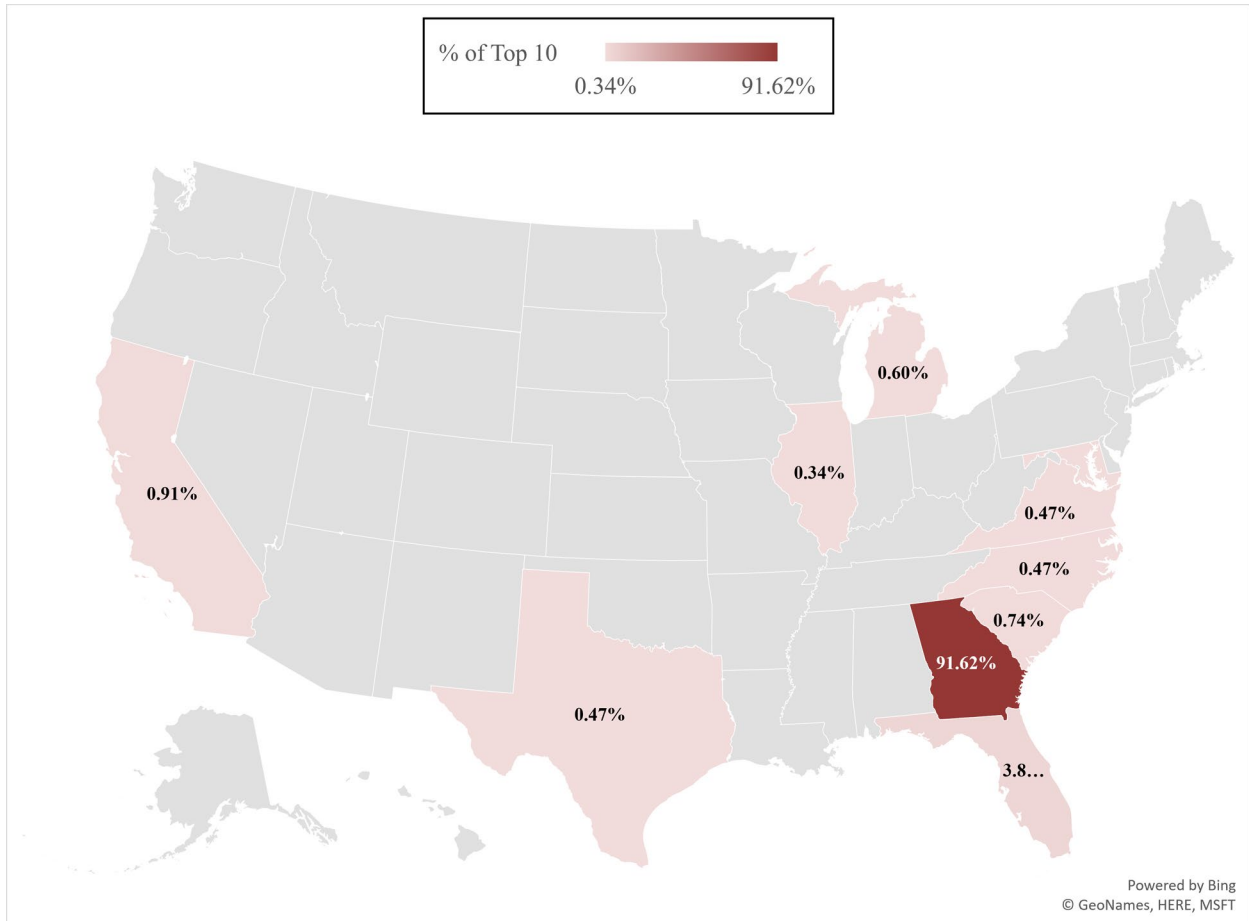

Figure 6: Total Student Enrollment Trends from Fall 2015- Fall 2019

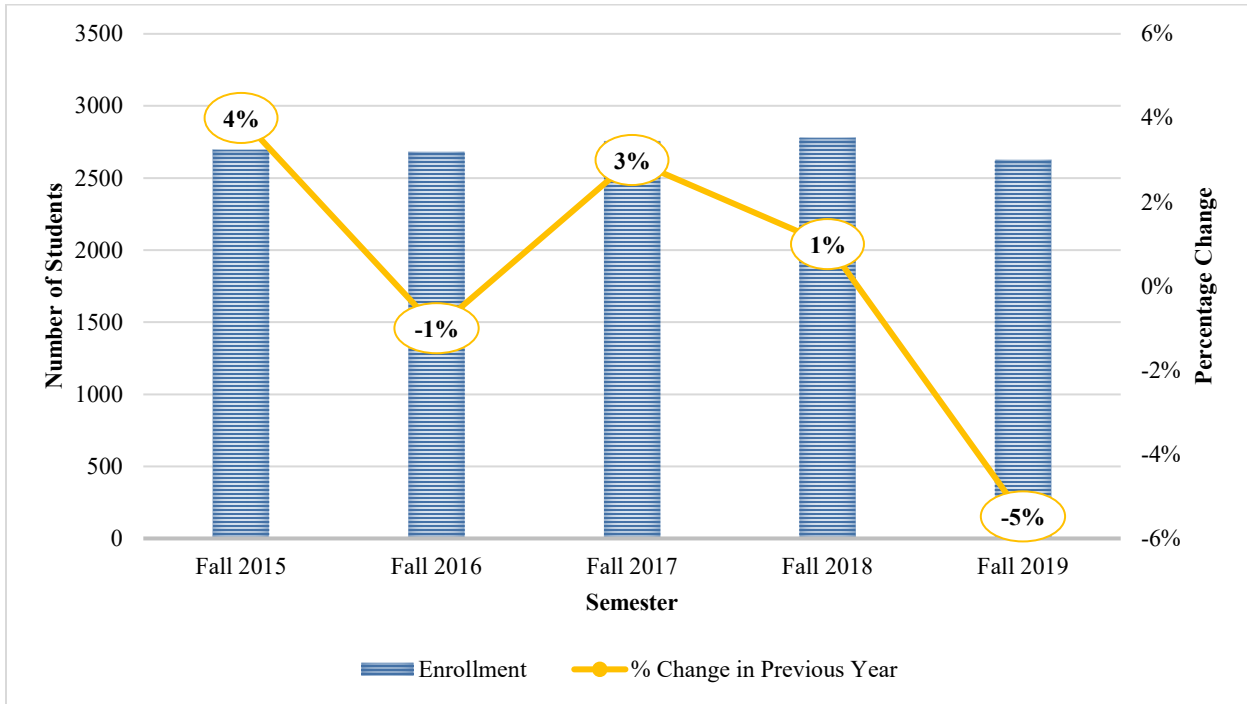

Figure 7: Enrollment Trends from Fall 2015- Fall 2019 by Gender

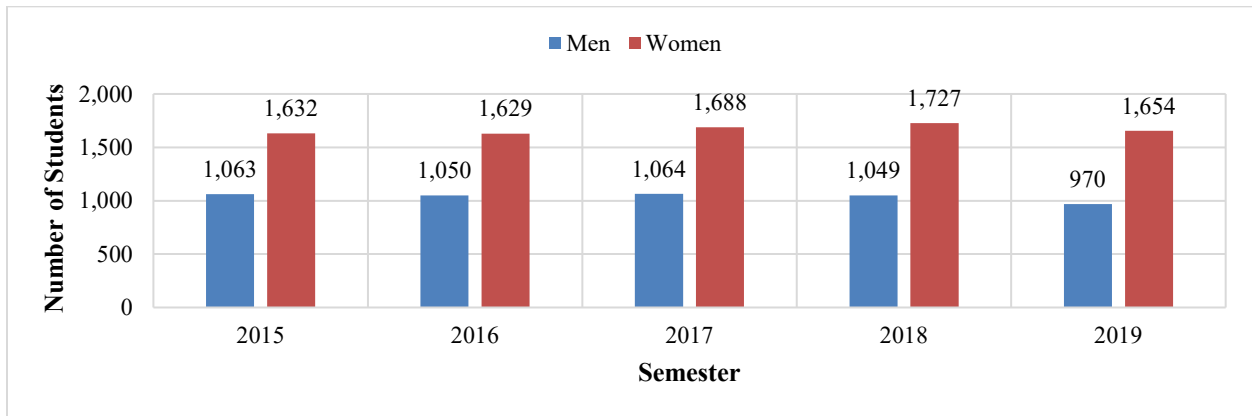
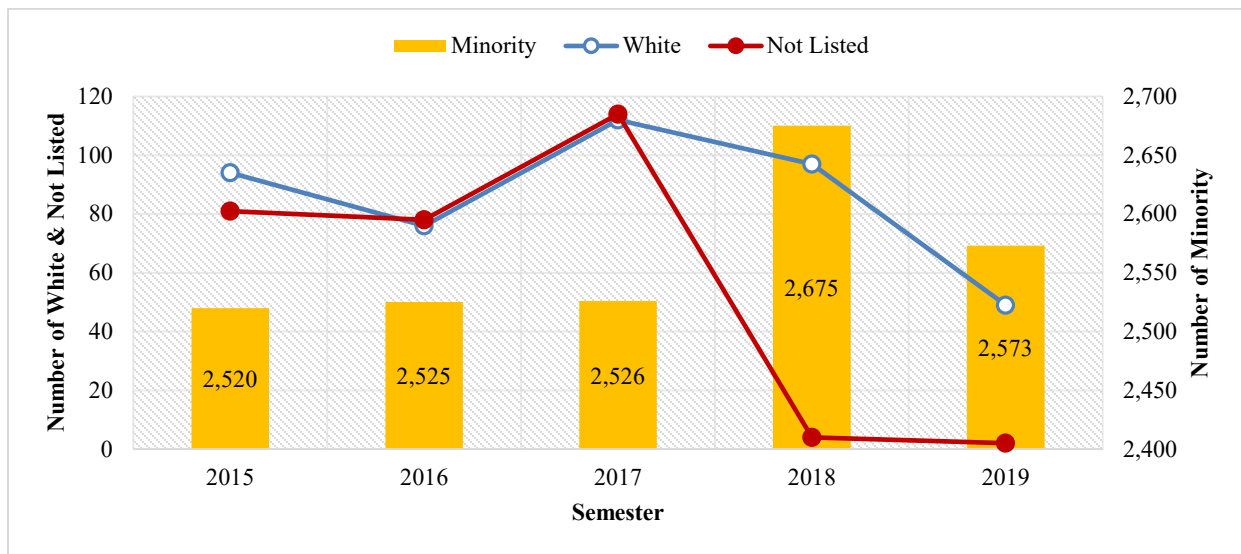


Figure 8: Fall 2015 –Fall 2019 Enrollment by Minority and Non – Minority

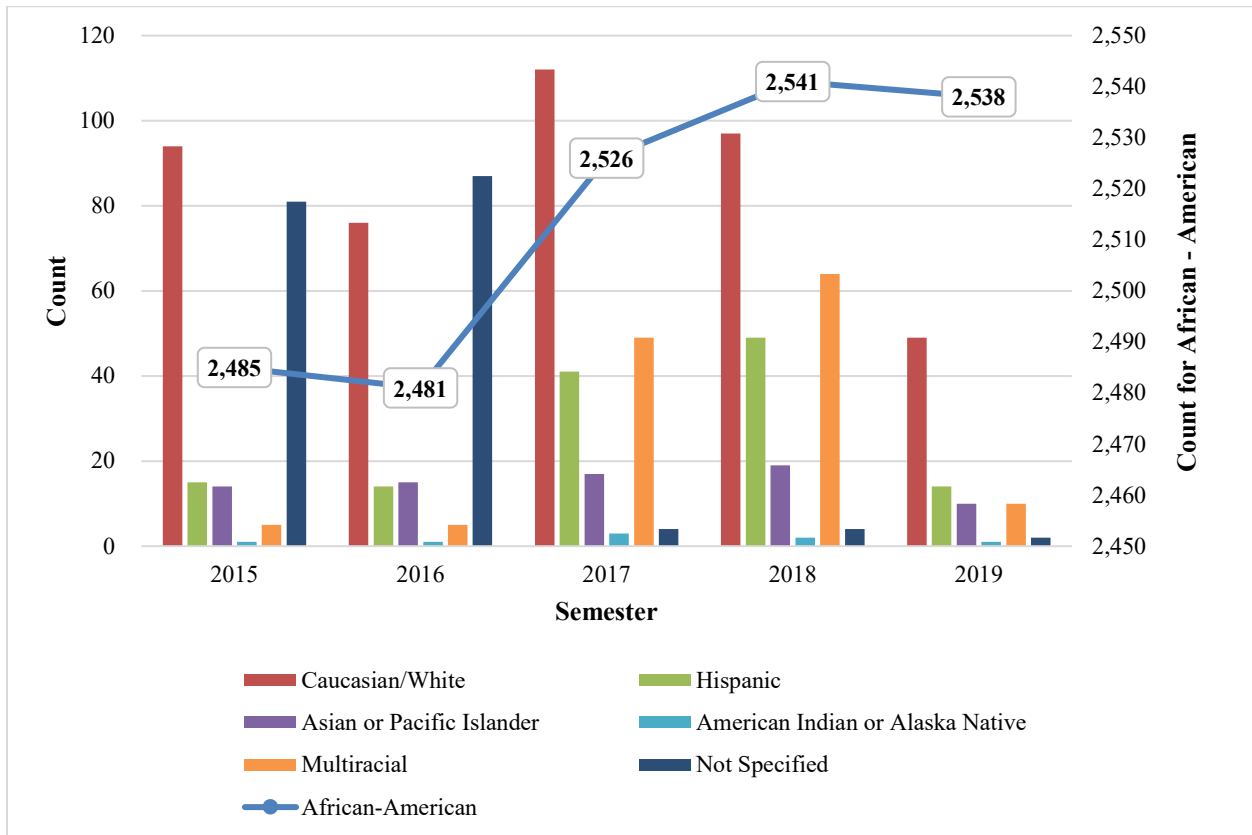

Figure 9: Enrollment Trends from Fall 2015- Fall 2019 by Race /Ethnicity

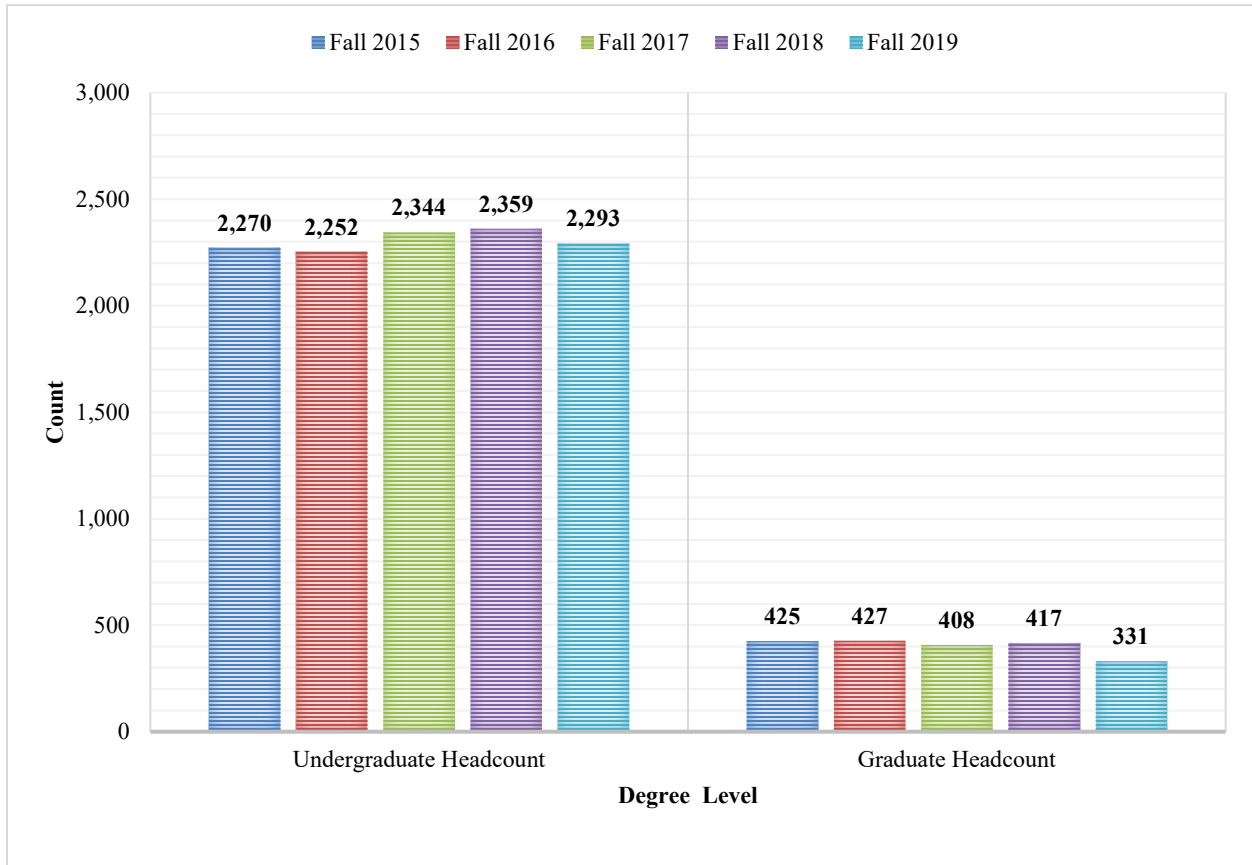

Figure 11: Fall 2015 – Fall 2019 Student Enrollments by Status & Gender

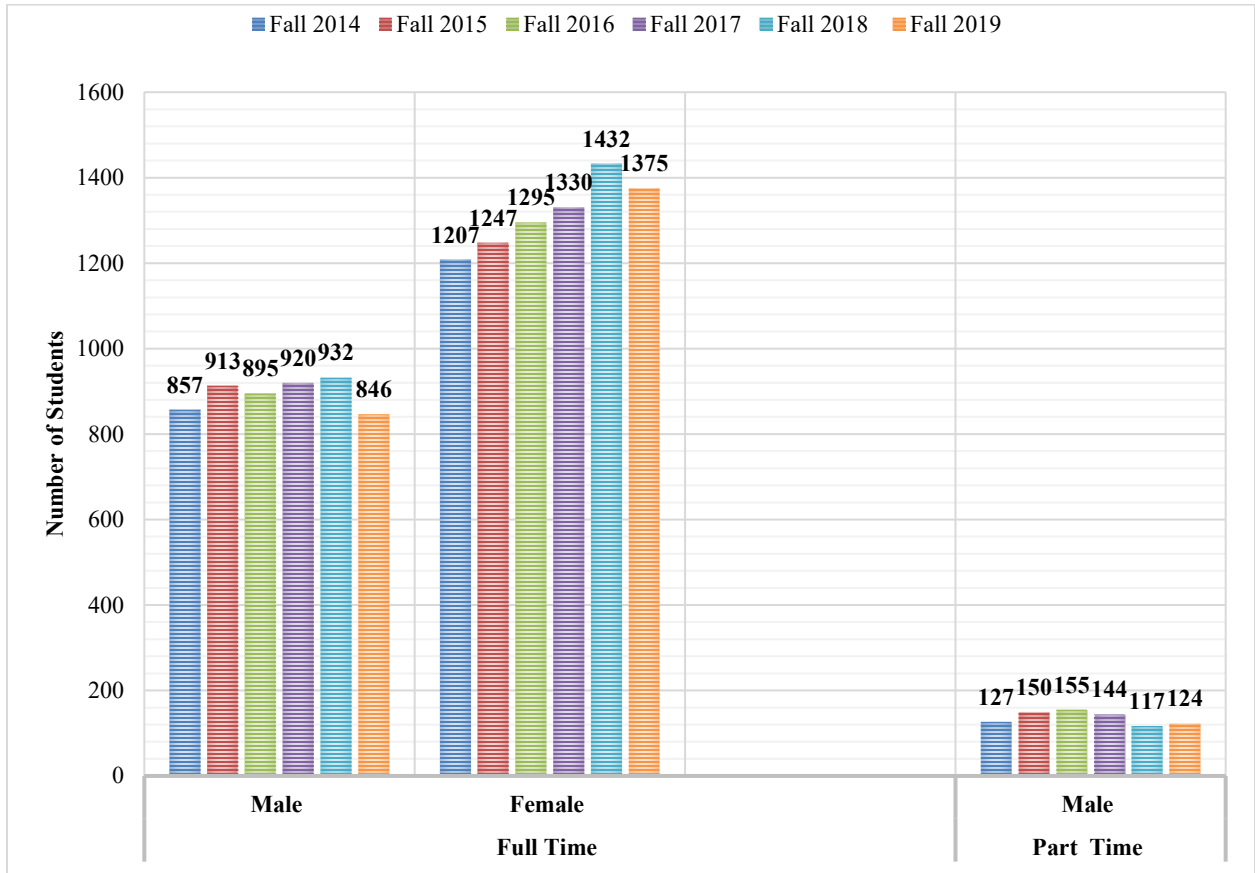
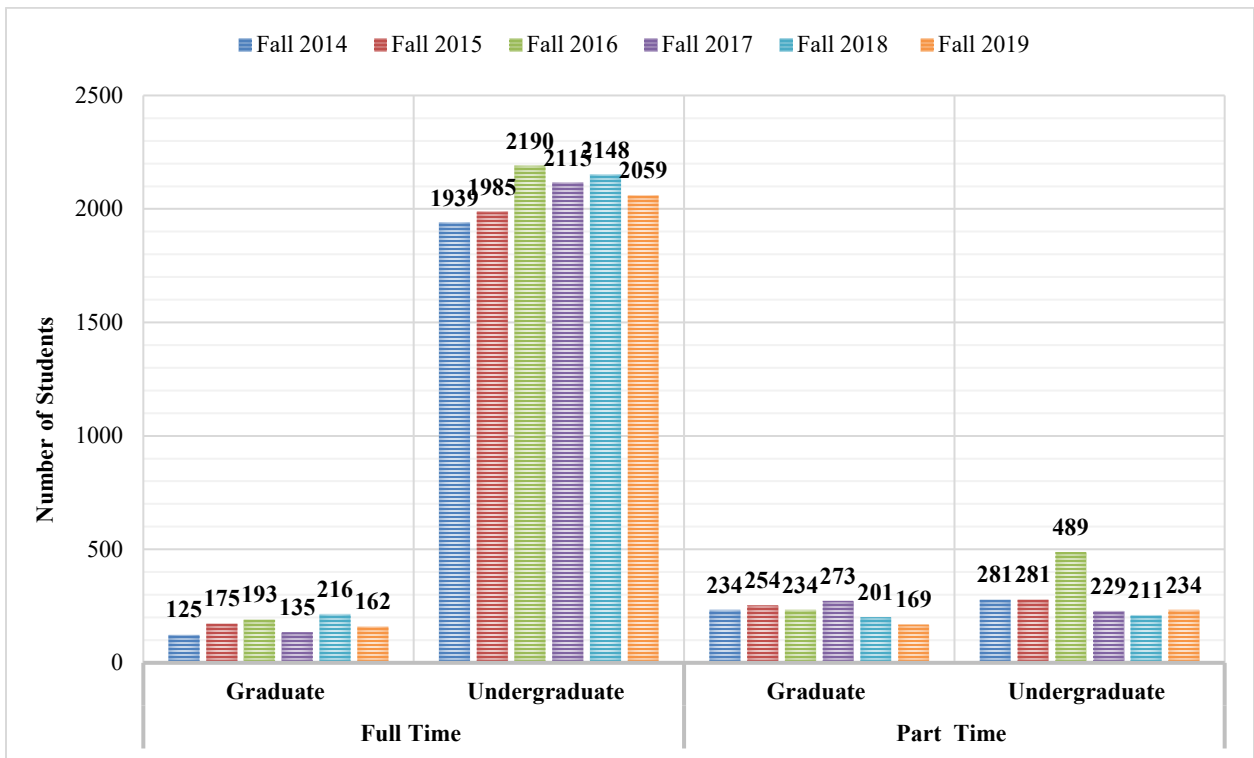

Figure 12: Fall 2015 – Fall 2019 Student Enrollments by Status & Degree Level

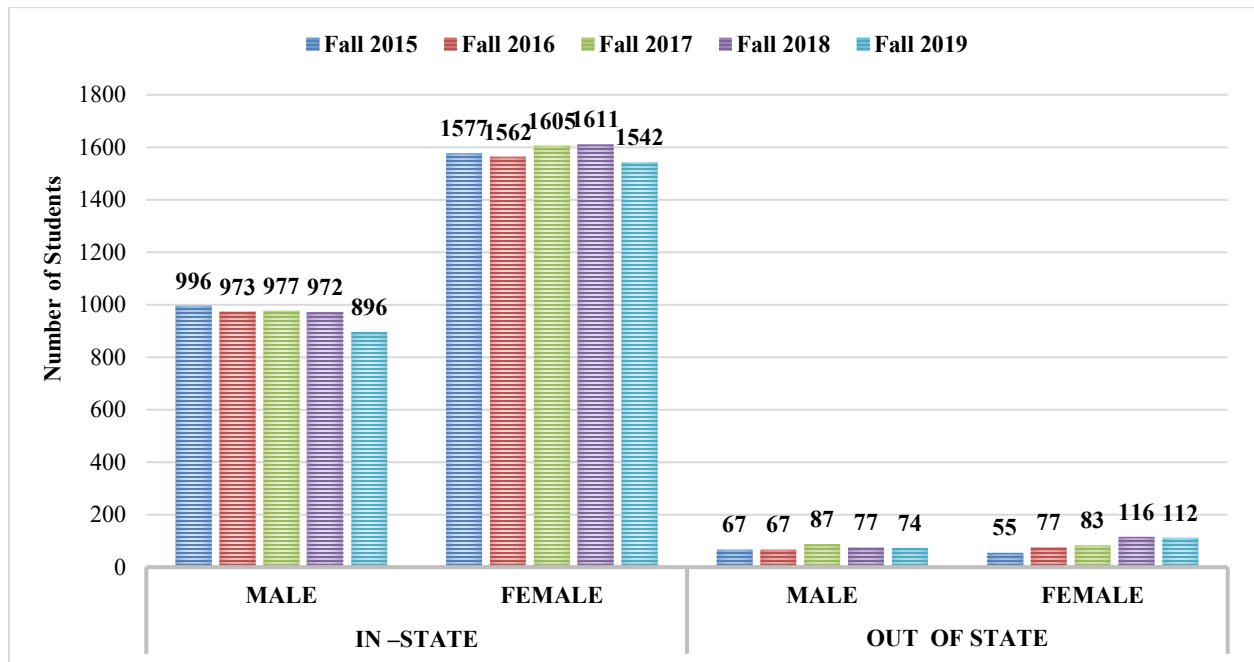

Figure 14: Enrollment Trends by Delivery Method

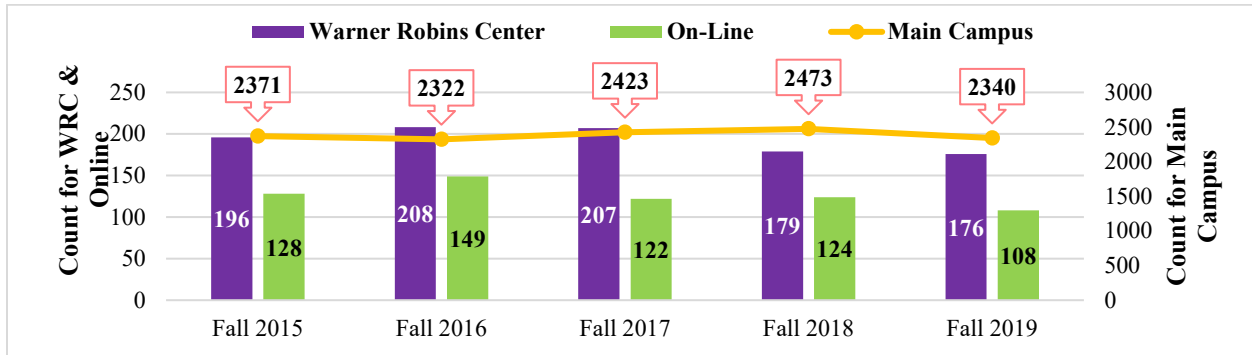
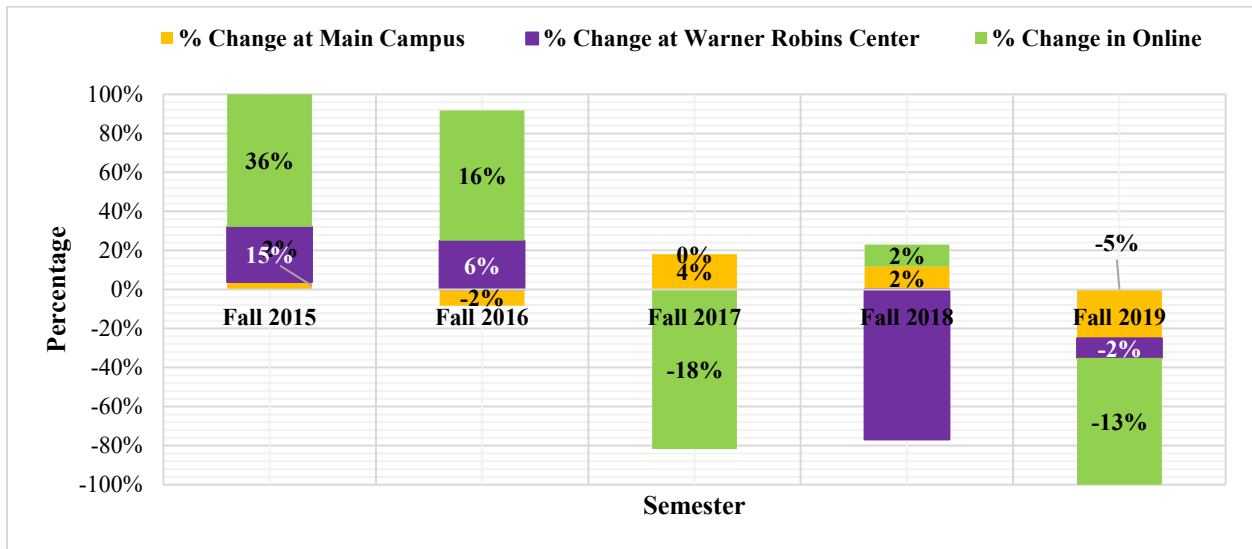


Figure 15: Enrollment Trends in Campus by Change in Percentage.



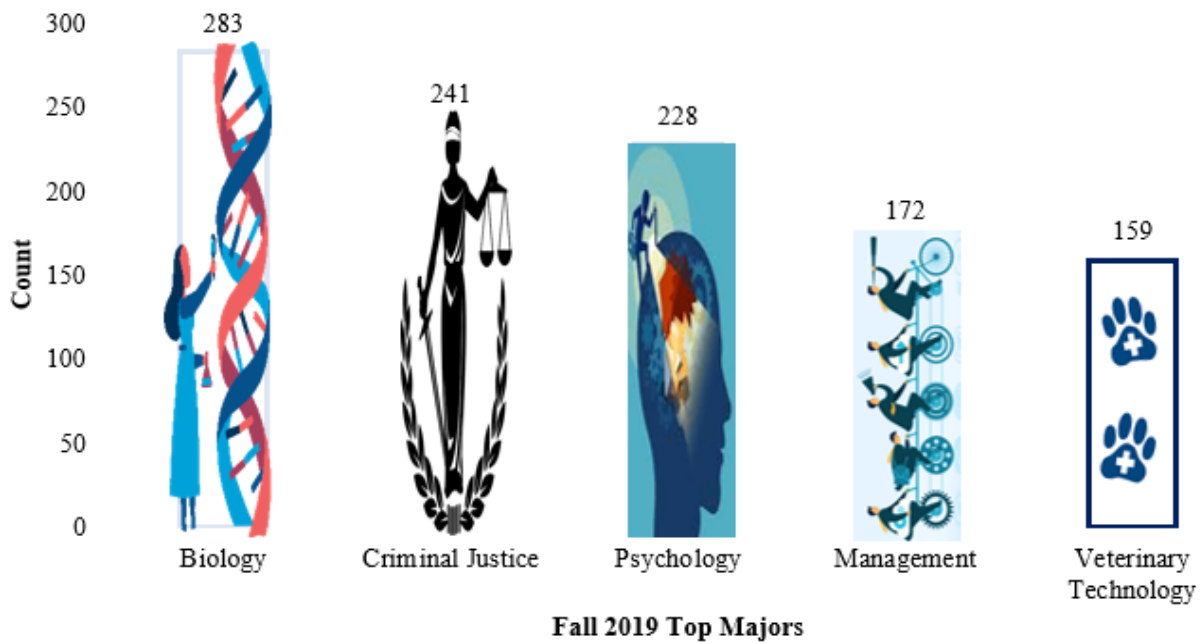

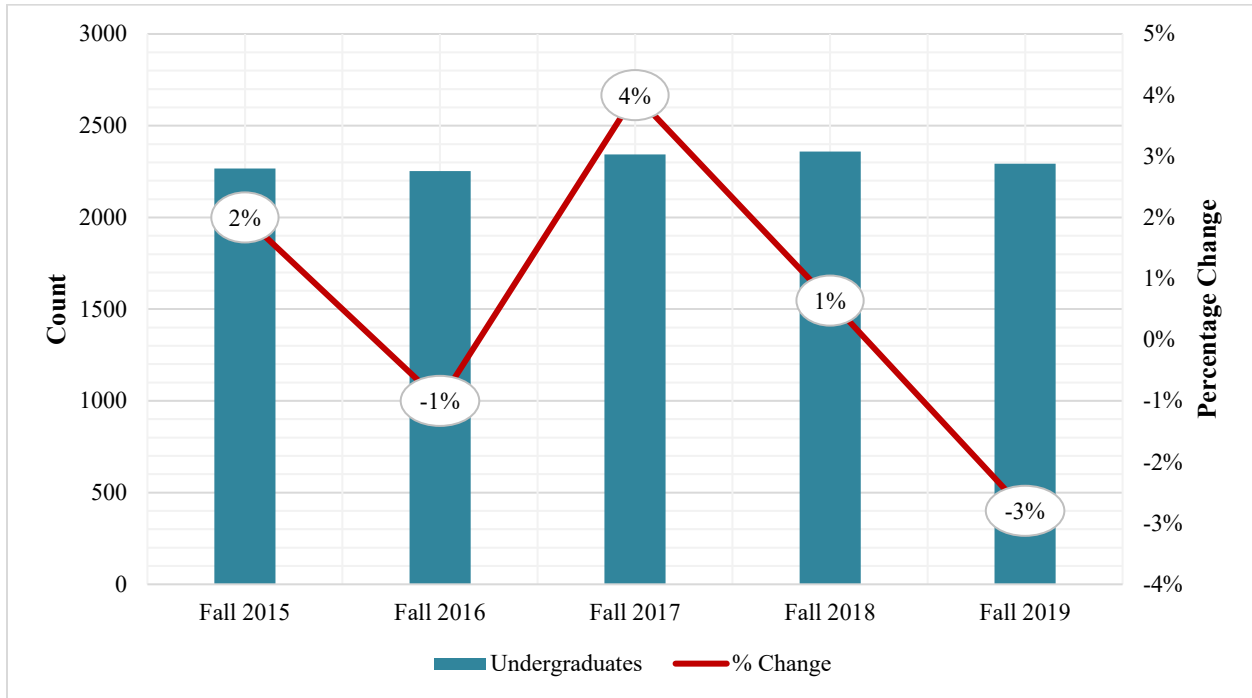

Figure 18: Fall 2015 – Fall 2019 Undergraduate Enrollments by Classification

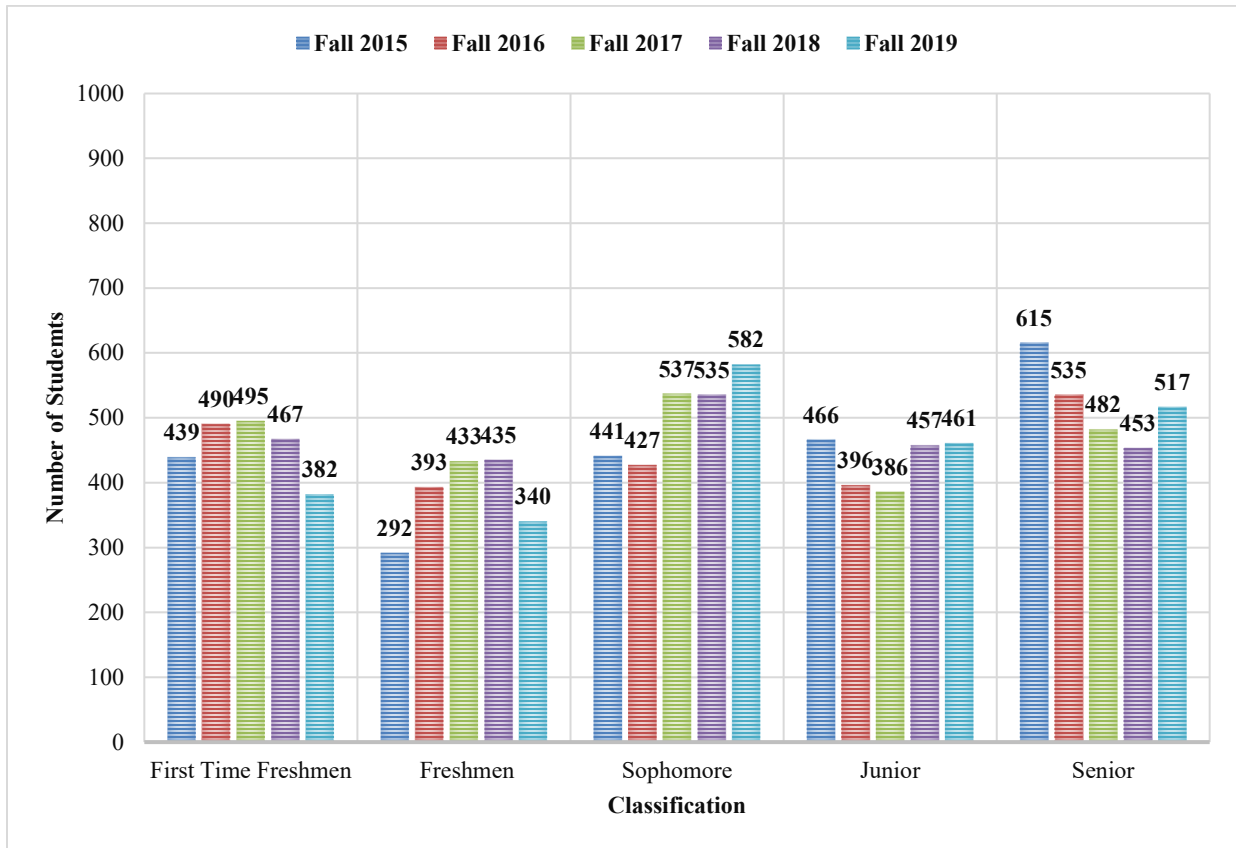

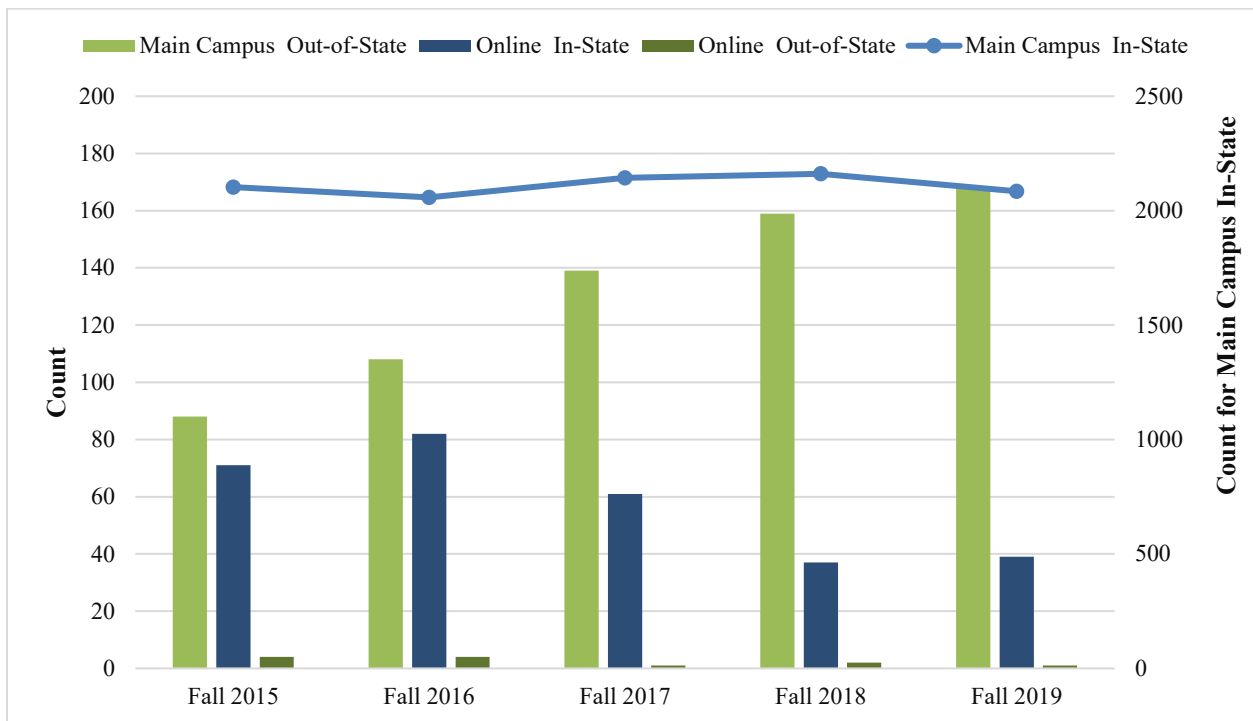

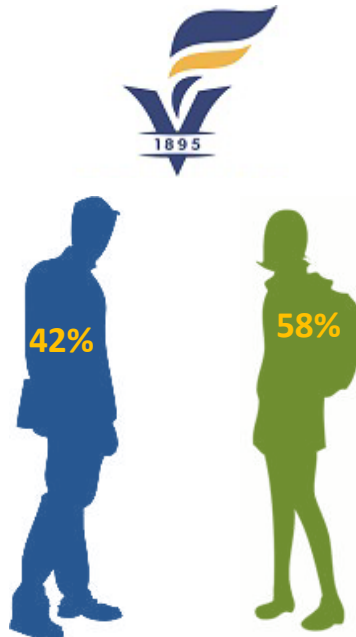

Figure 20: Fall 2019 First-Time Freshmen Enrollment by Gender

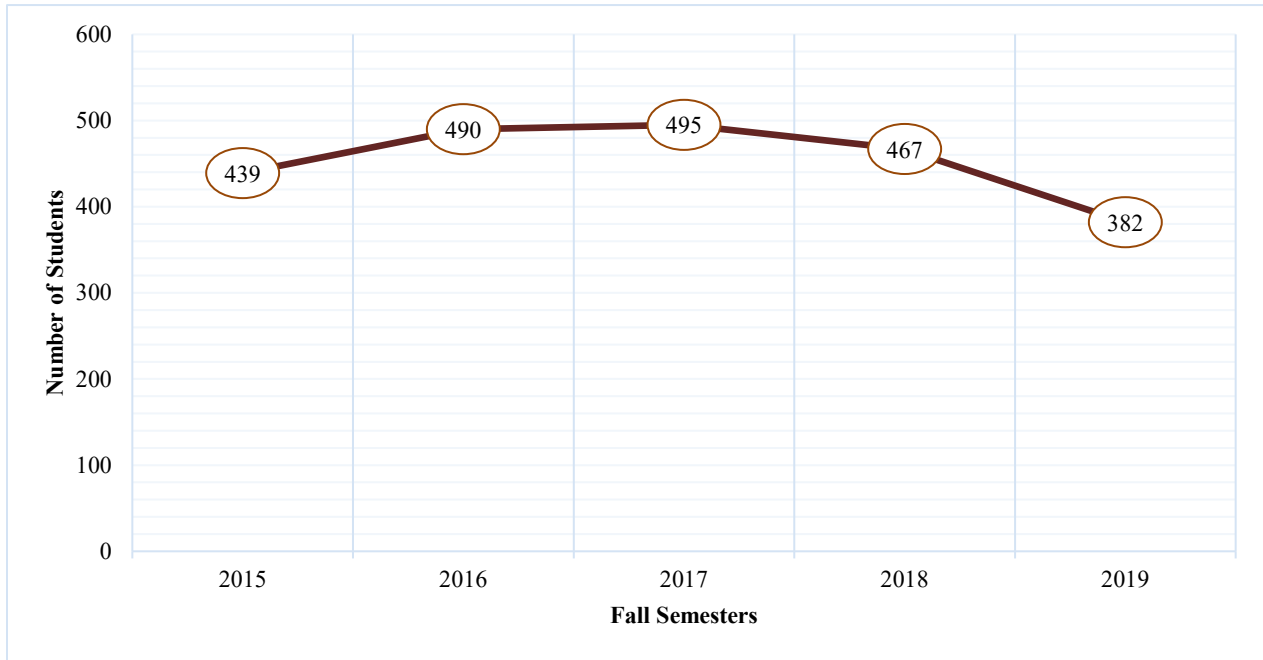

Figure 21: Fall 2015 – Fall 2019 First-Time Freshmen Enrollment by Gender

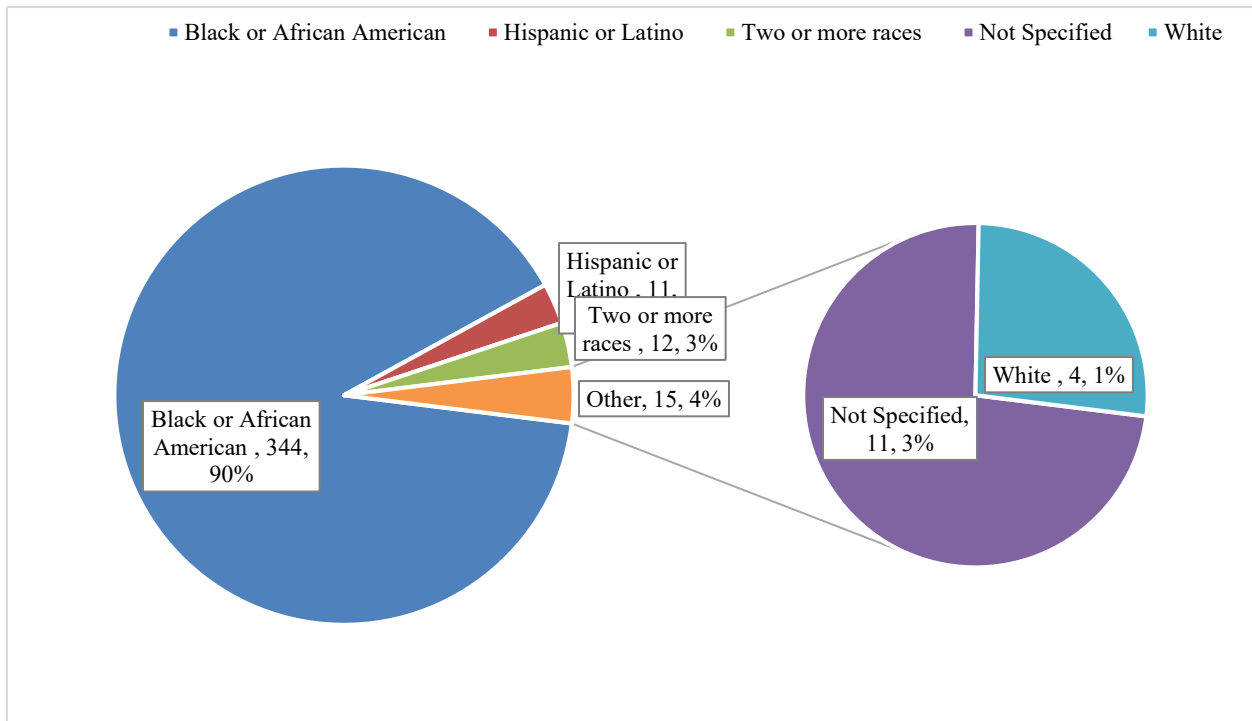

Figure 22: Fall 2019 First-Time Freshmen Enrollment by Ethnicity

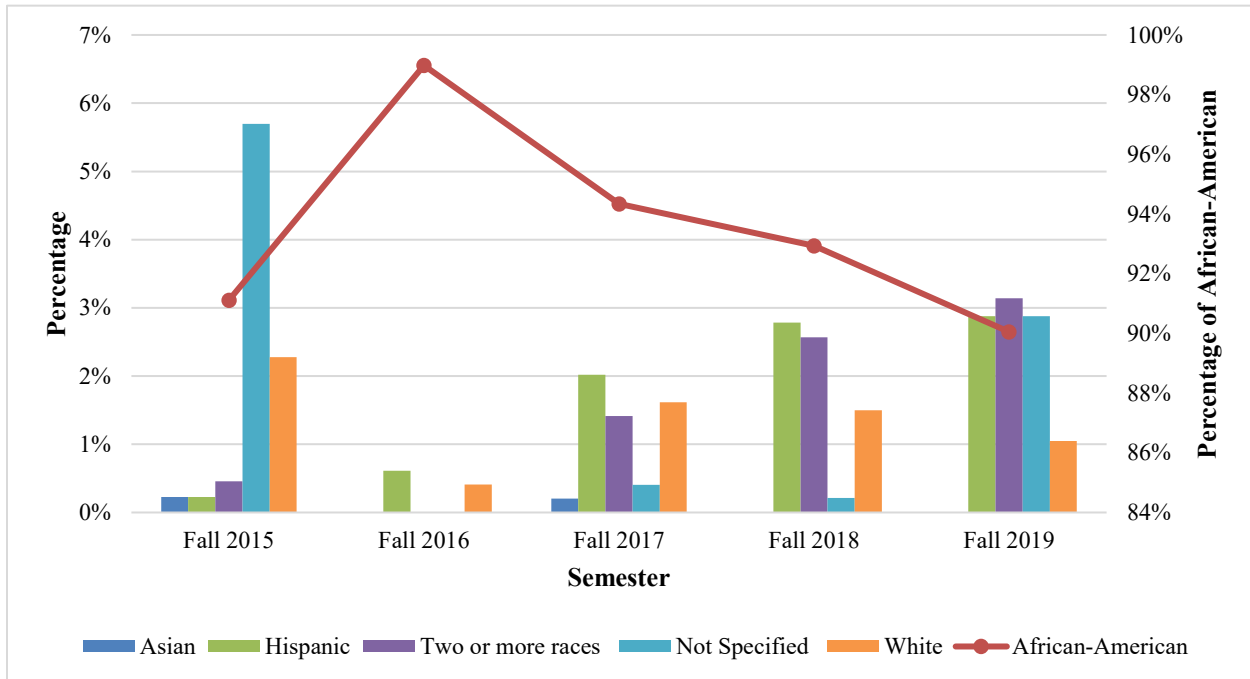

Figure 23: Fall 2015– Fall 2019 First-time Freshmen Enrollment by Ethnicity

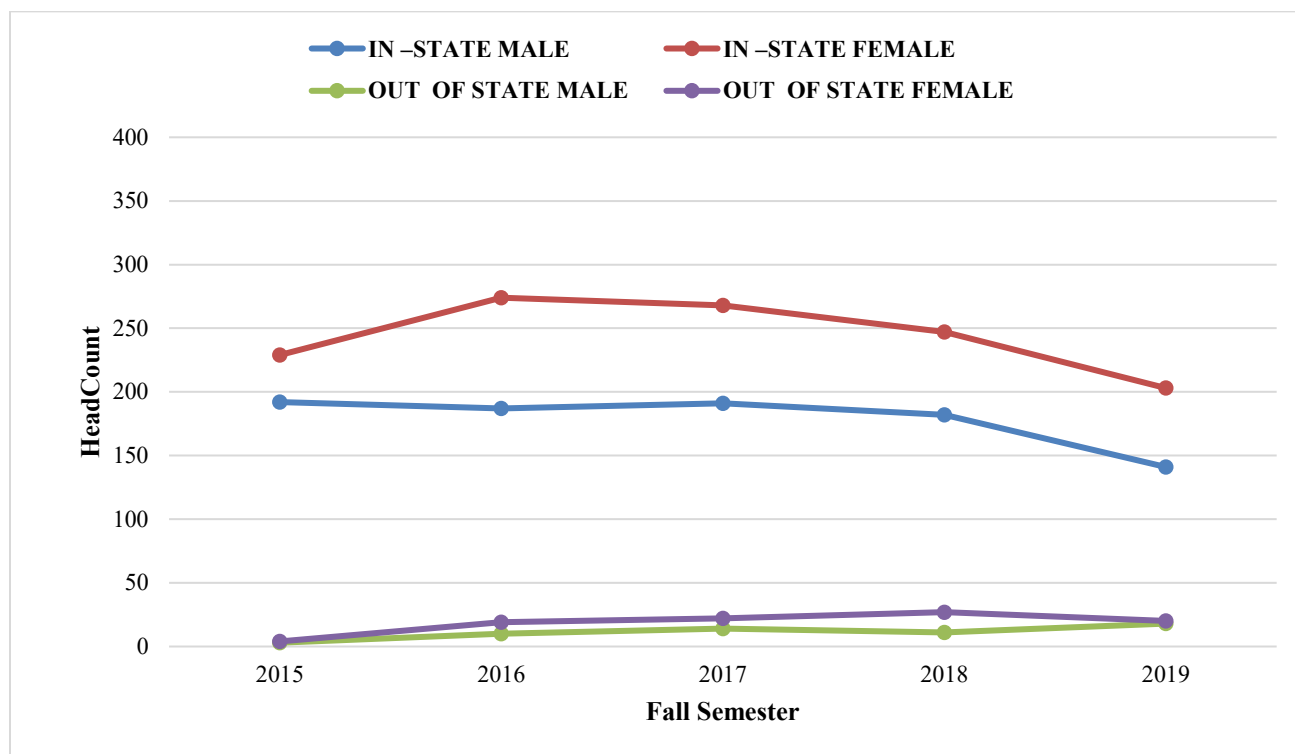

Figure 25: Fall 2019 Freshmen Enrollment by State of Origin

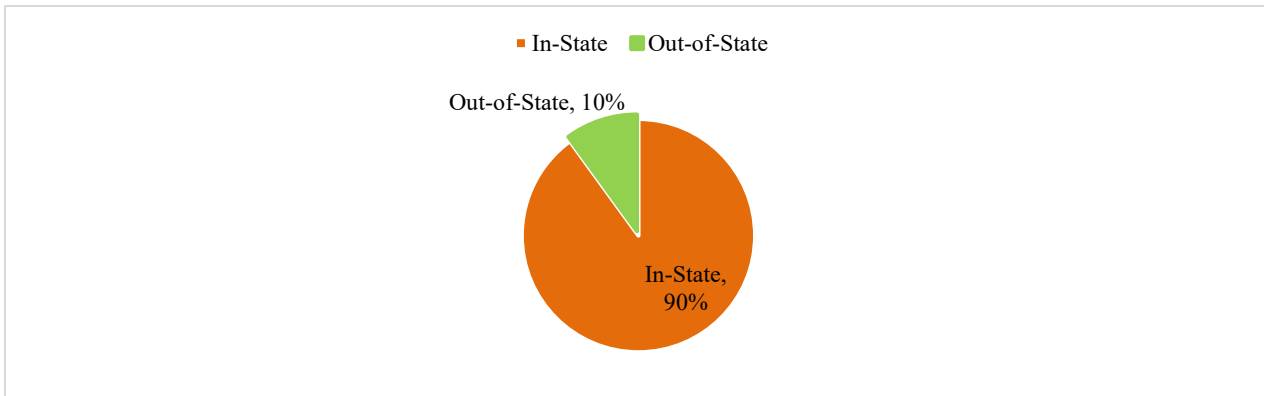
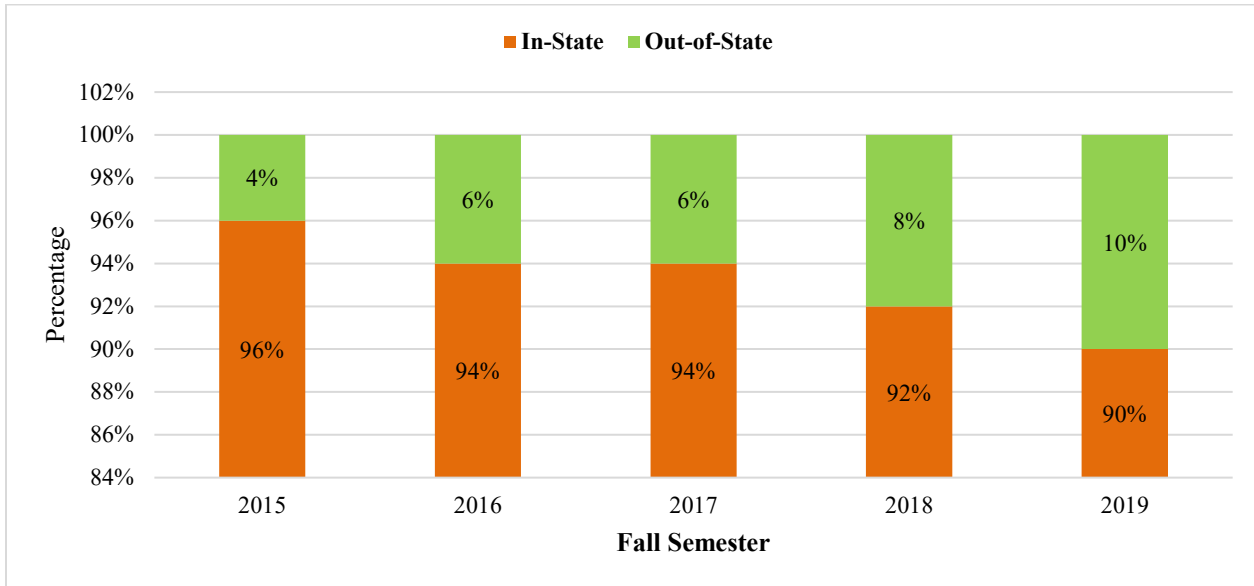


Figure 26: Fall 2015 -2019 First Time Freshmen Enrollment by State of Origin

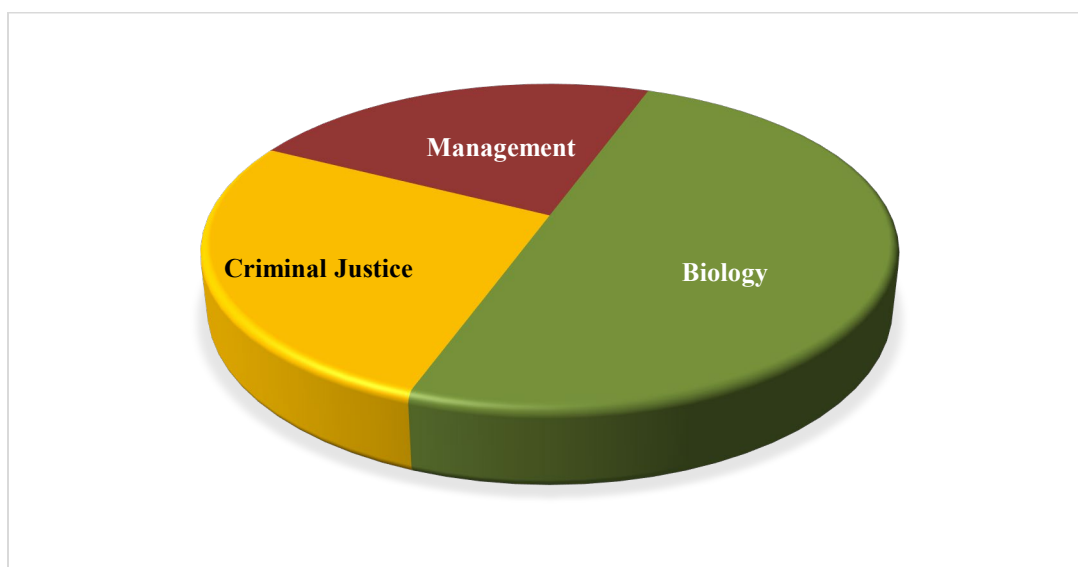

Figure 27: Fall 2019 Top 3 Majors by First Time Freshmen

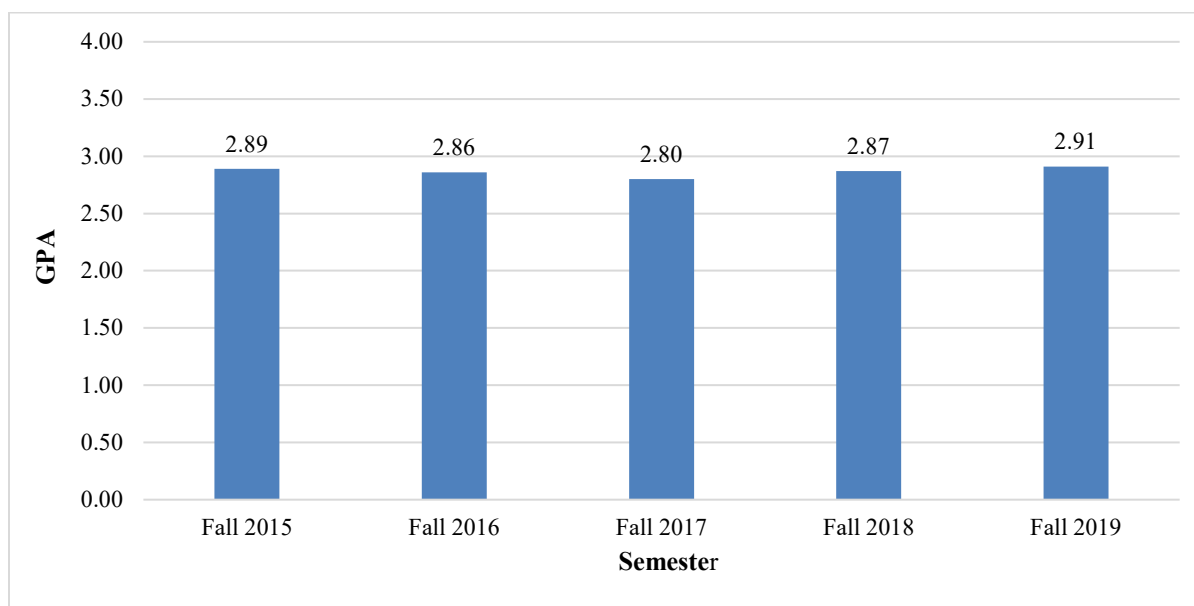

Figure 28: Fall 2015 – Fall 2019 FTF High School GPA Trends

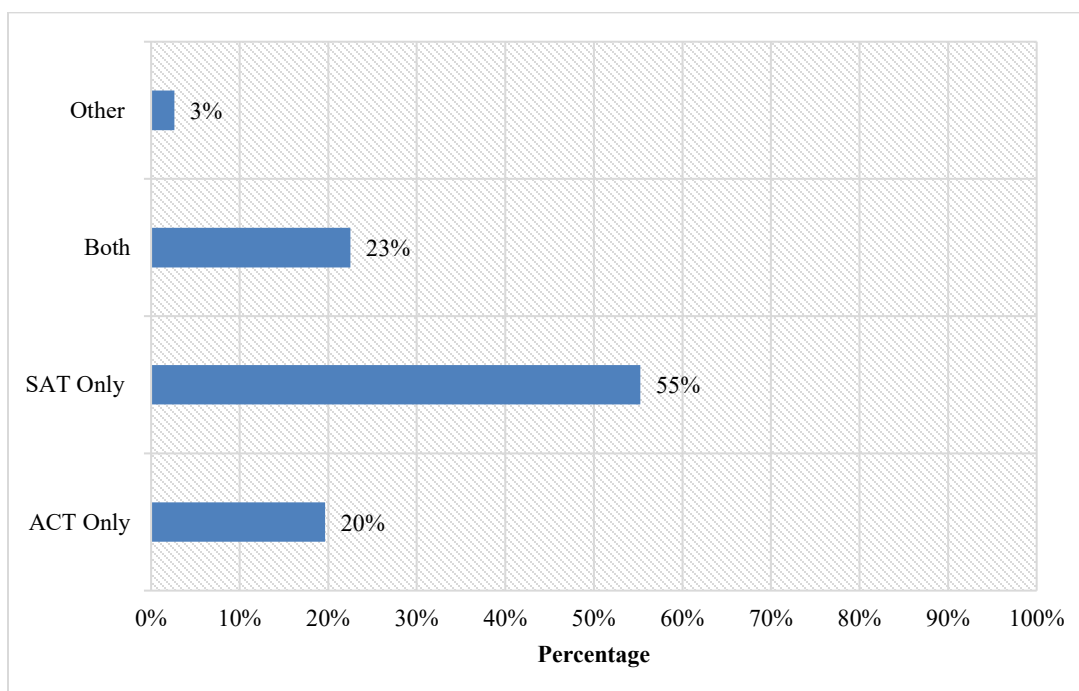

Figure 30: Fall 2015 – Fall 2019 First Time Freshmen by Mean ACT Scores

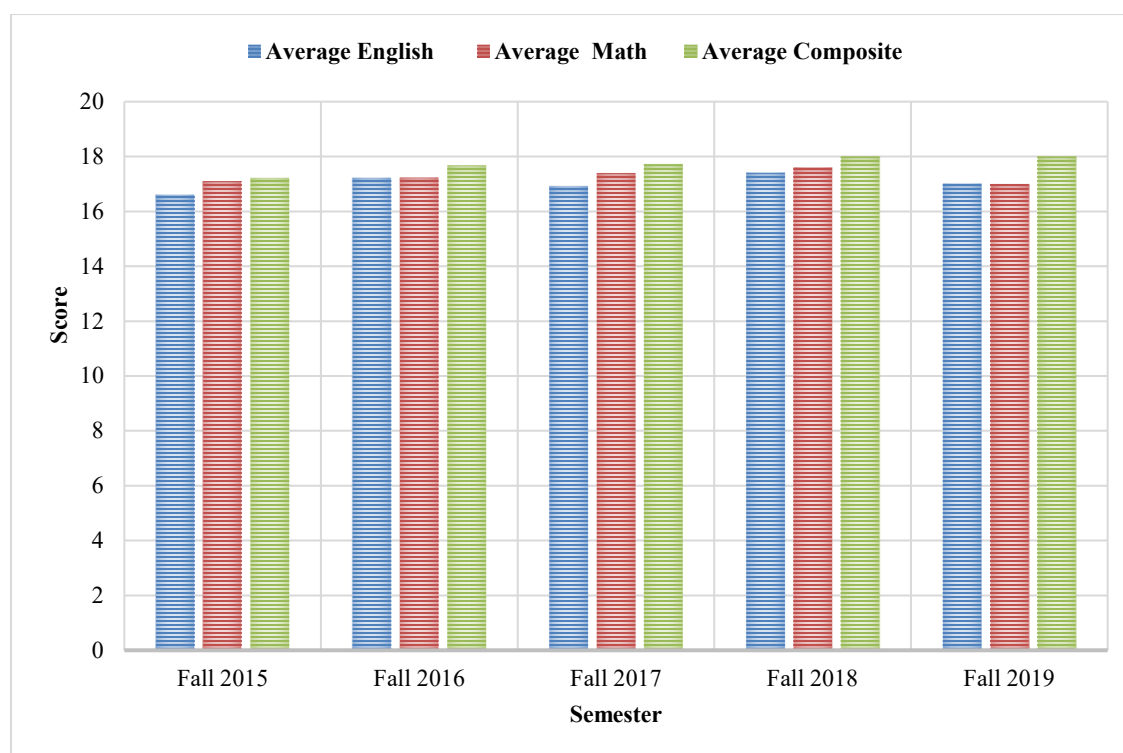
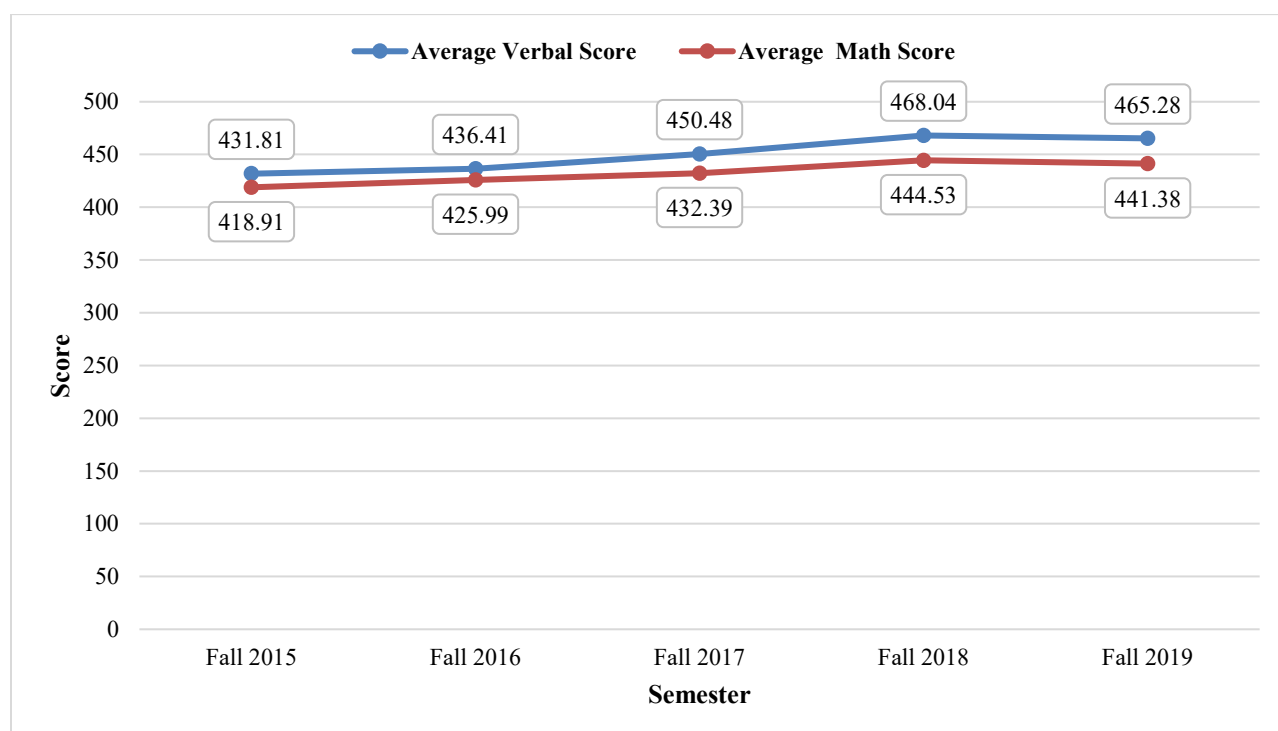

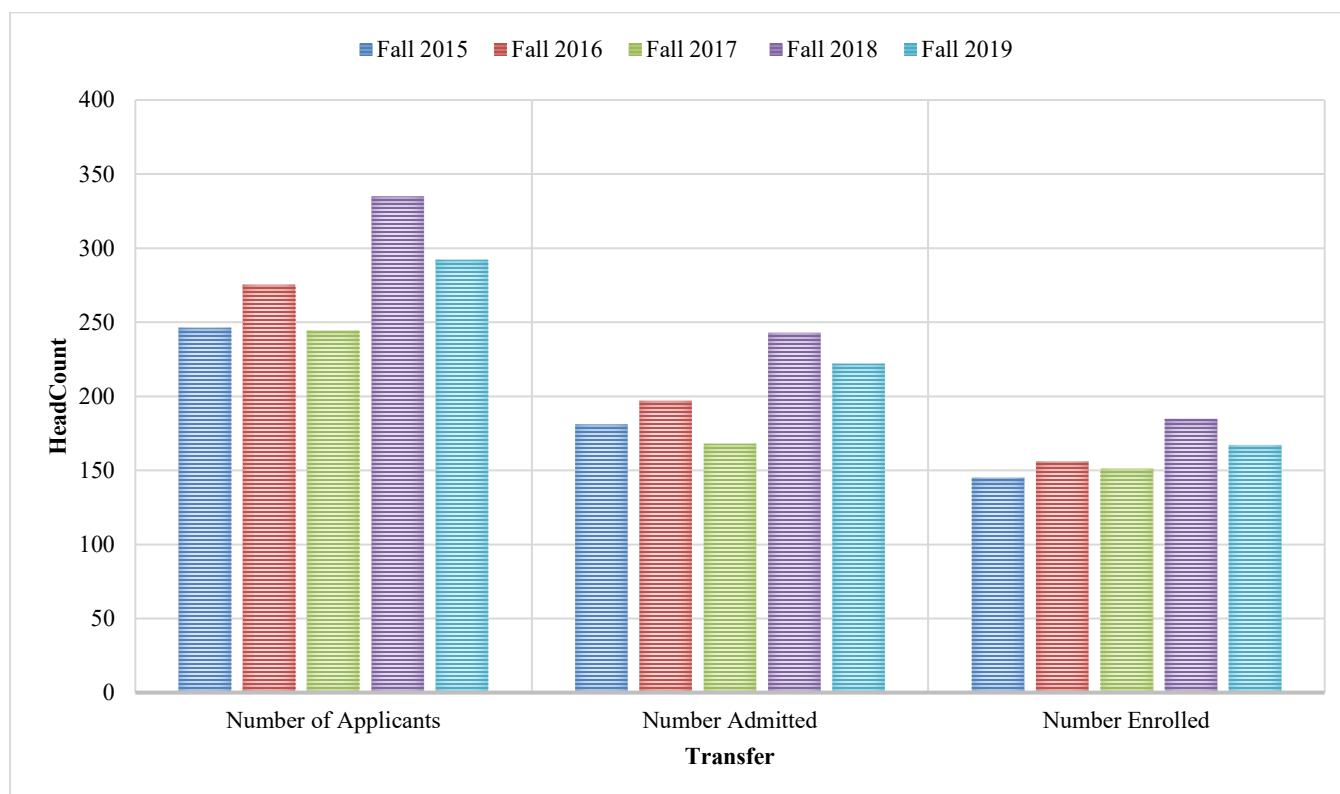

Figure 32: Fall 2015-2019 Transfer Student Applied, Admitted and Enrollment

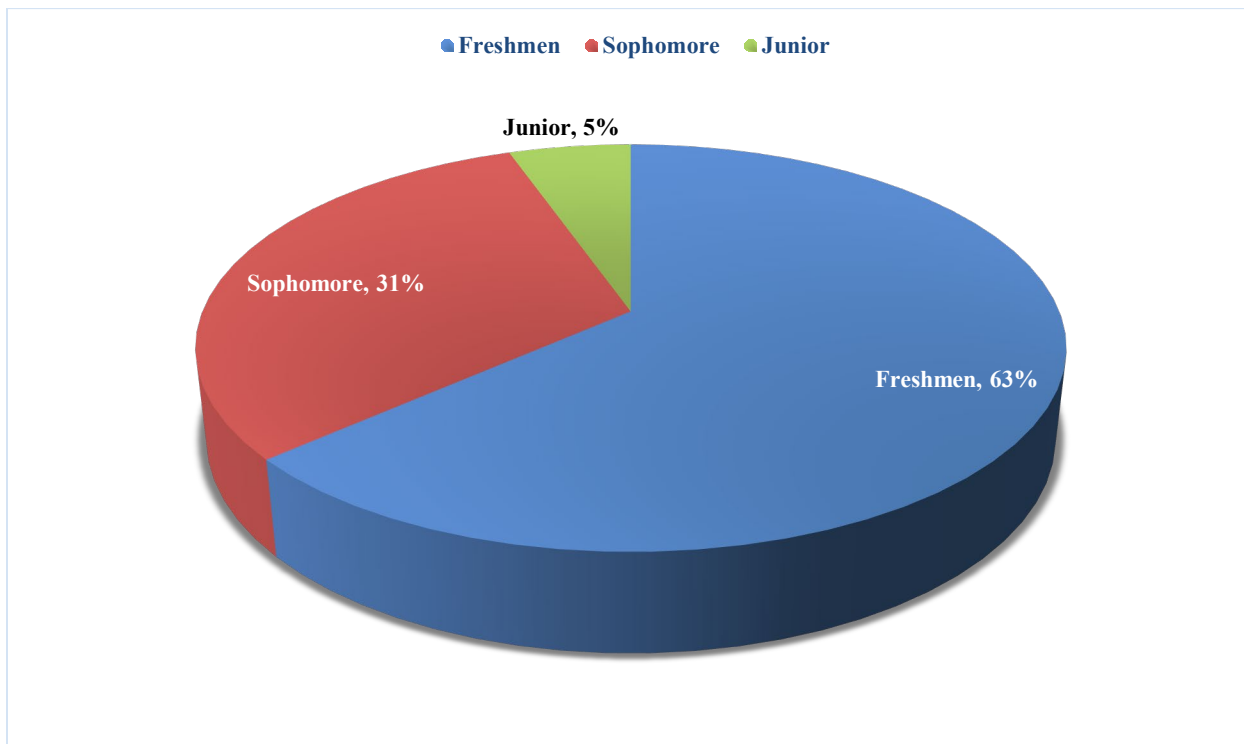

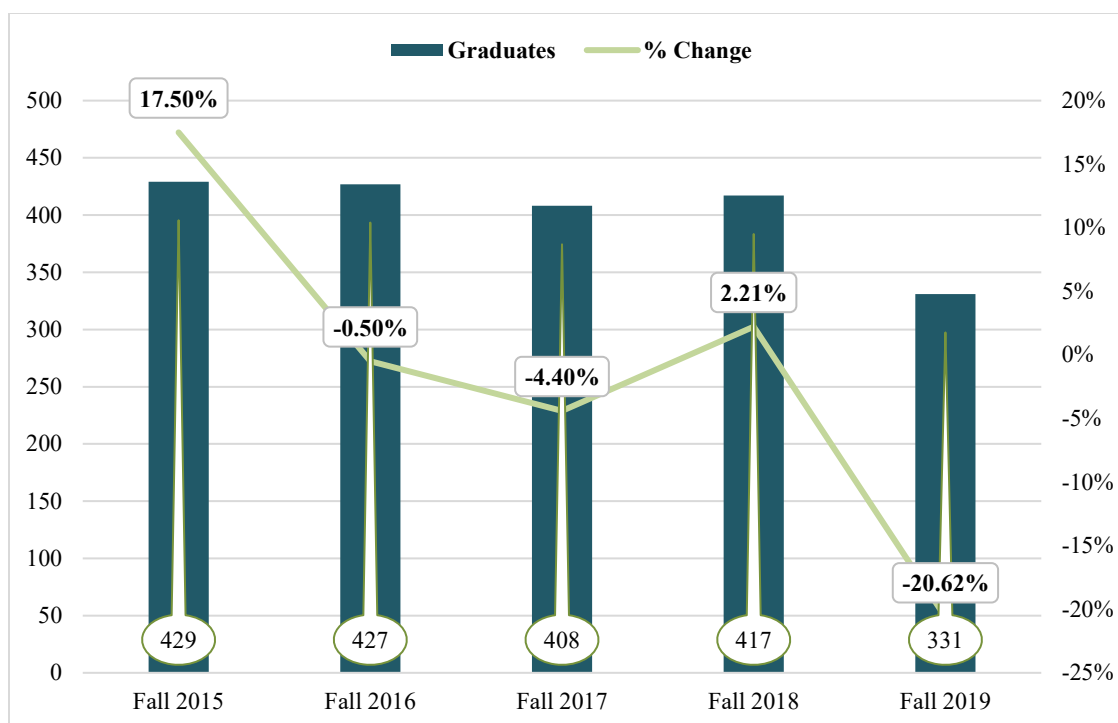

Figure 34: Fall 2015 – Fall 2019 Graduate Student Enrollment

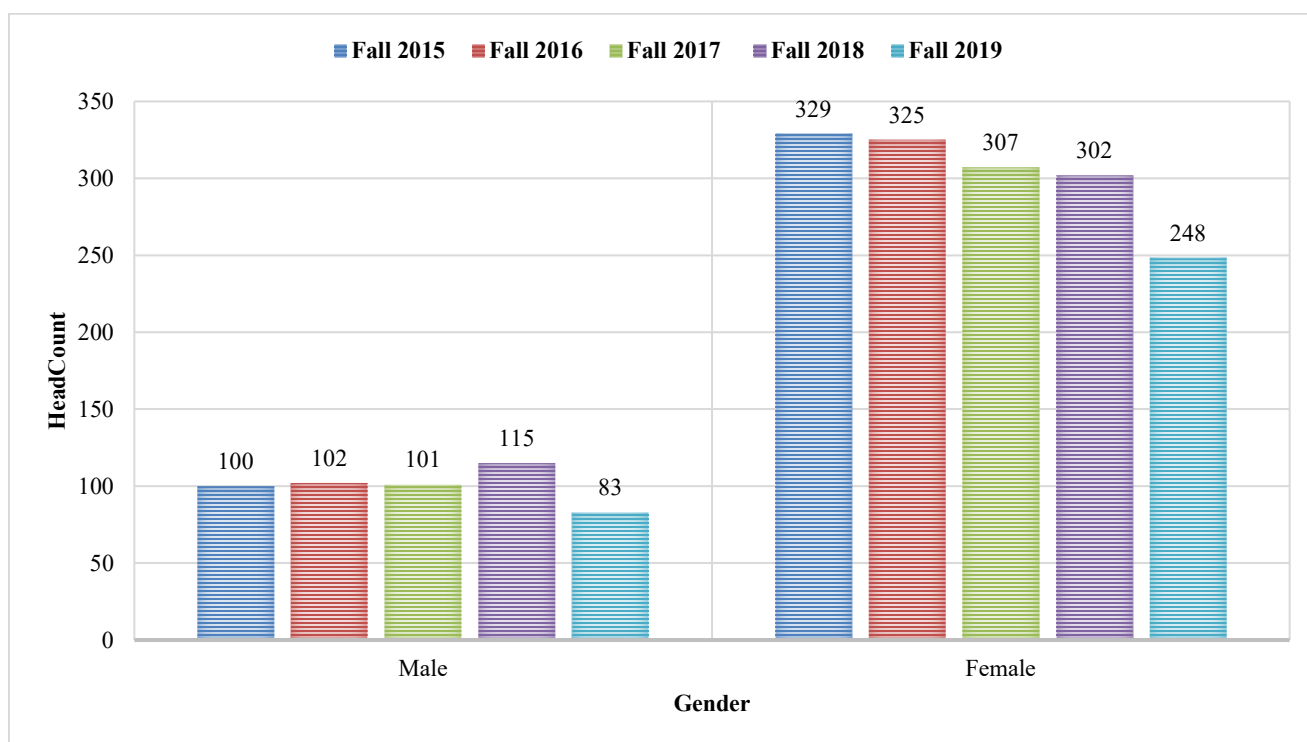

Figure 35: Fall 2015 - Fall 2019 Graduate Enrollment by Gender

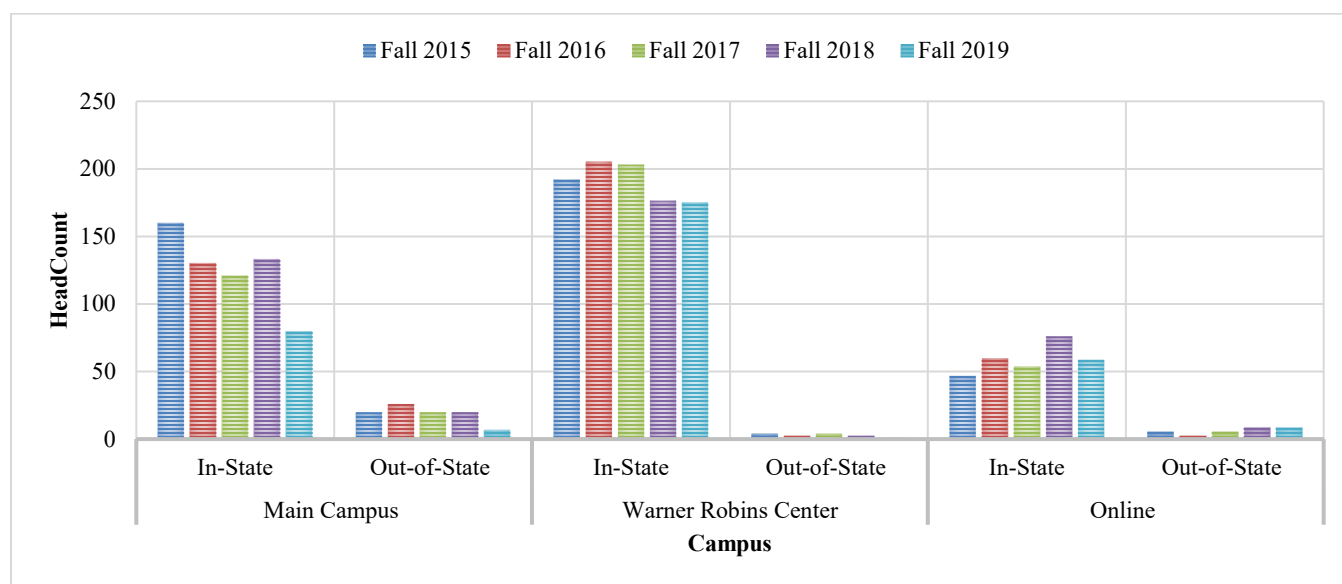

Figure 37: College of Agriculture, Family Sciences & Technology Enrollment Trends by Major

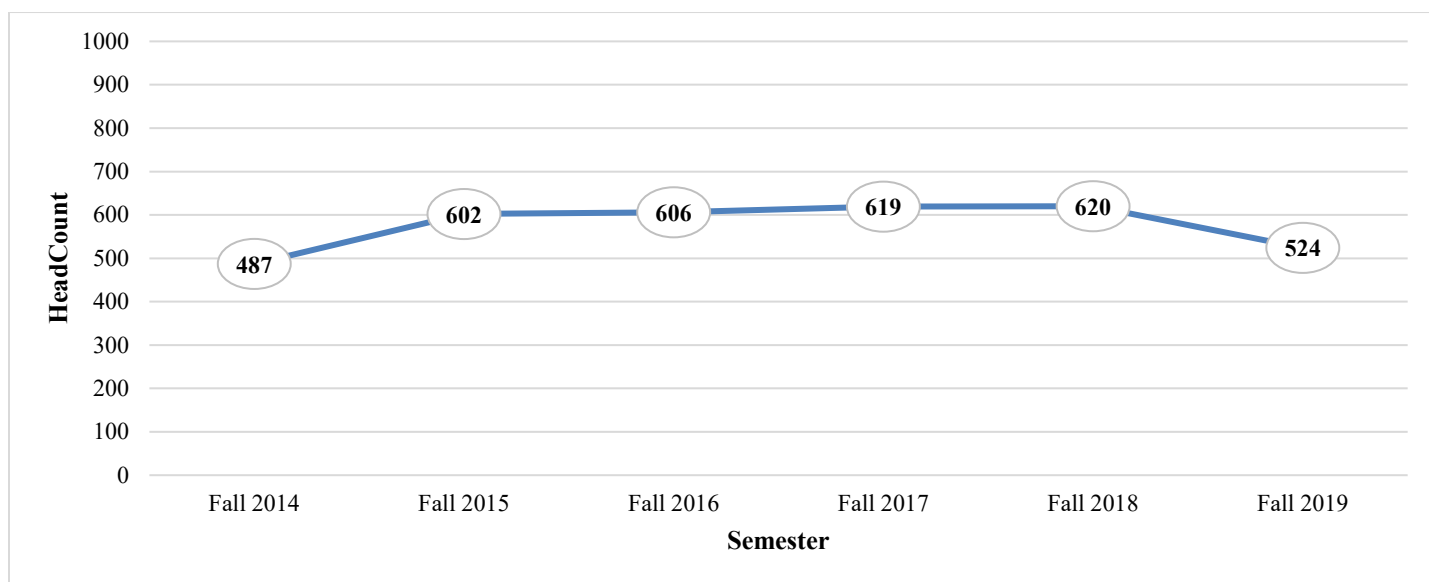

Figure 38: College of Arts & Science Enrollment Trends by Major

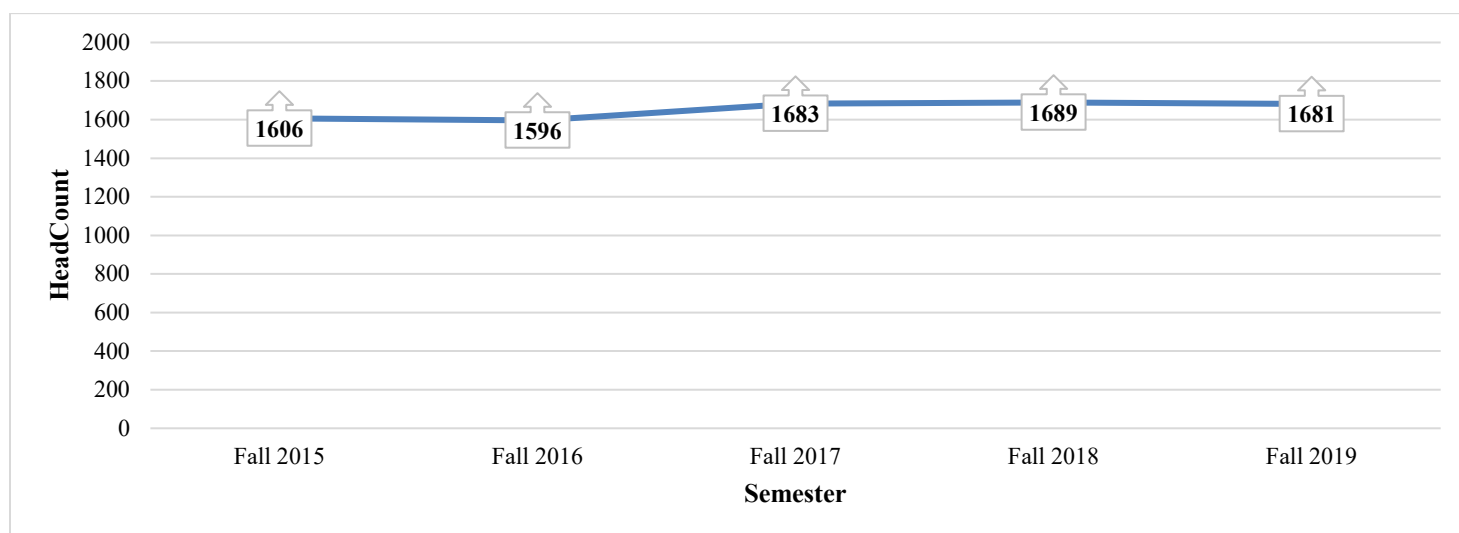
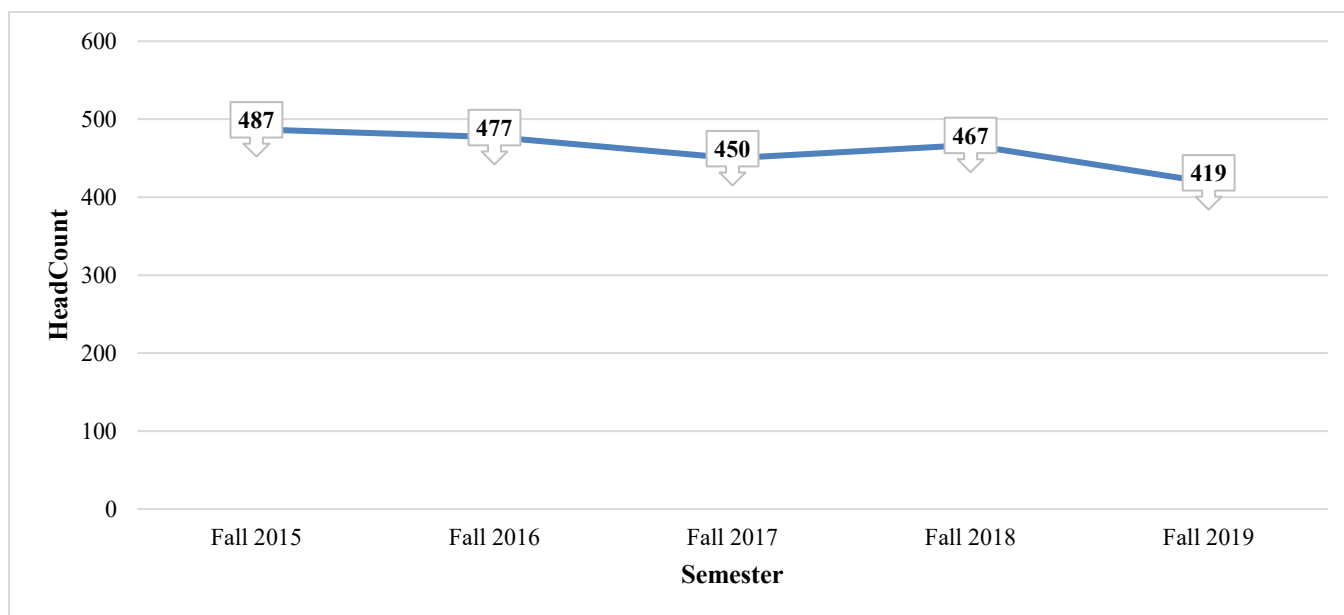

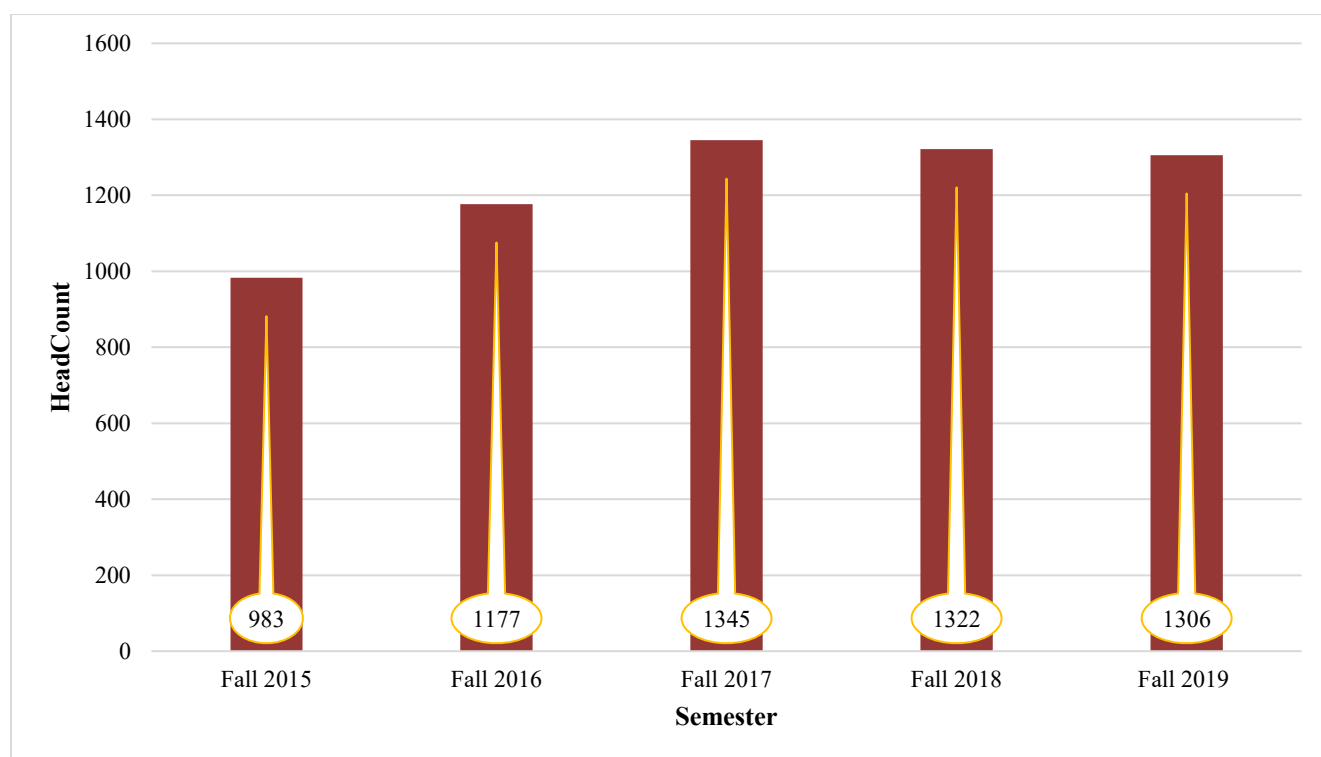

Figure 40: Fall 2015 –Fall 2019 Housing Trends

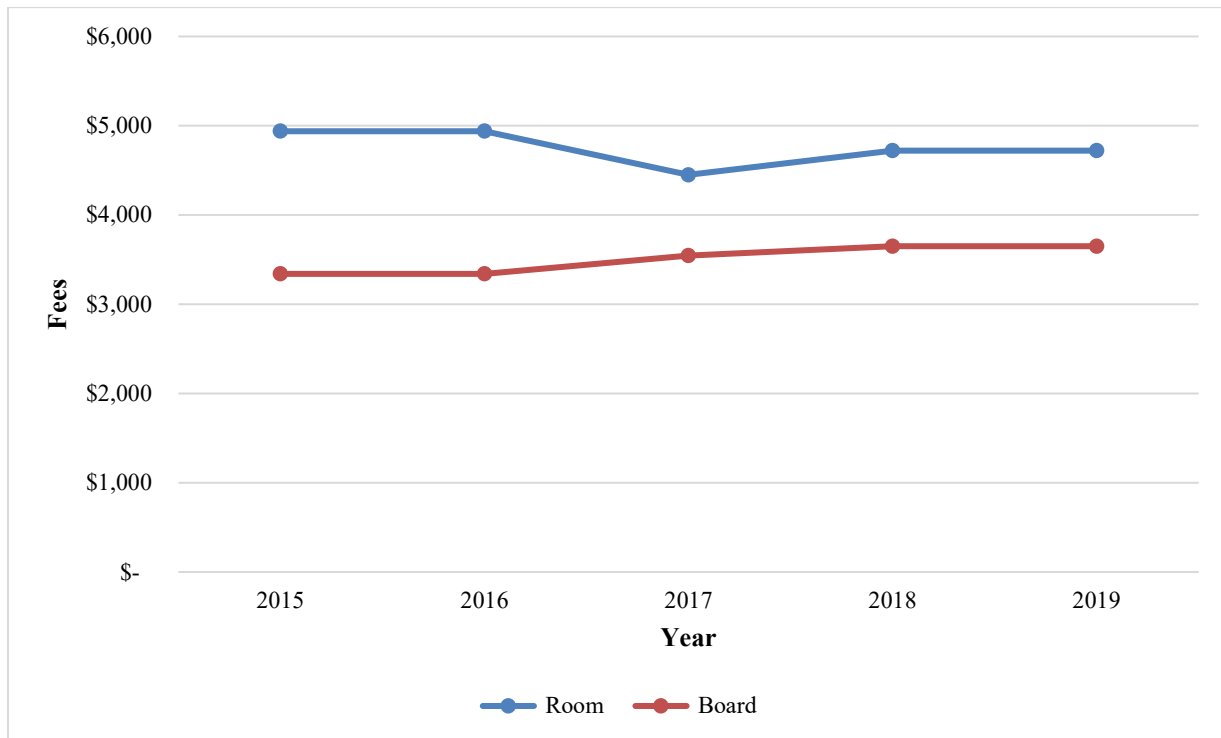

Figure 42: FY 15 – FY 19 Degrees Conferred

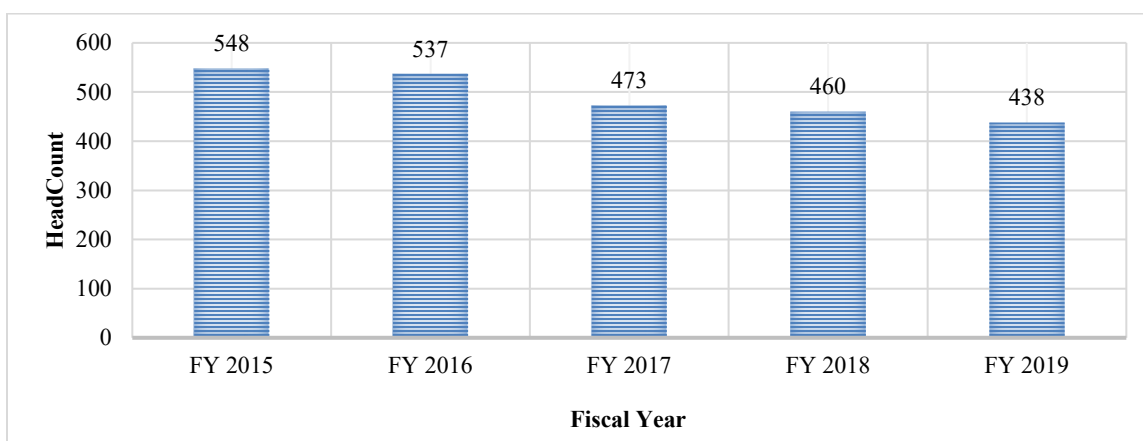


Figure 43: FY 15 – FY 19 Degrees Conferred by Degree Level

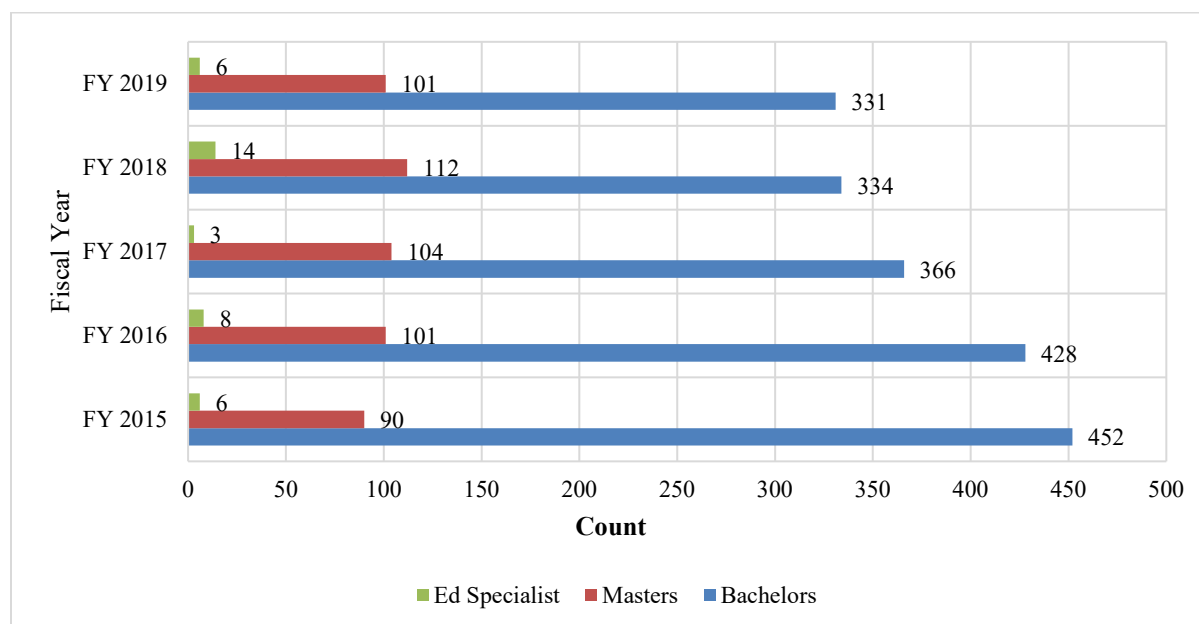

Figure 44: Bachelor Degree Six Year Graduation Rates.

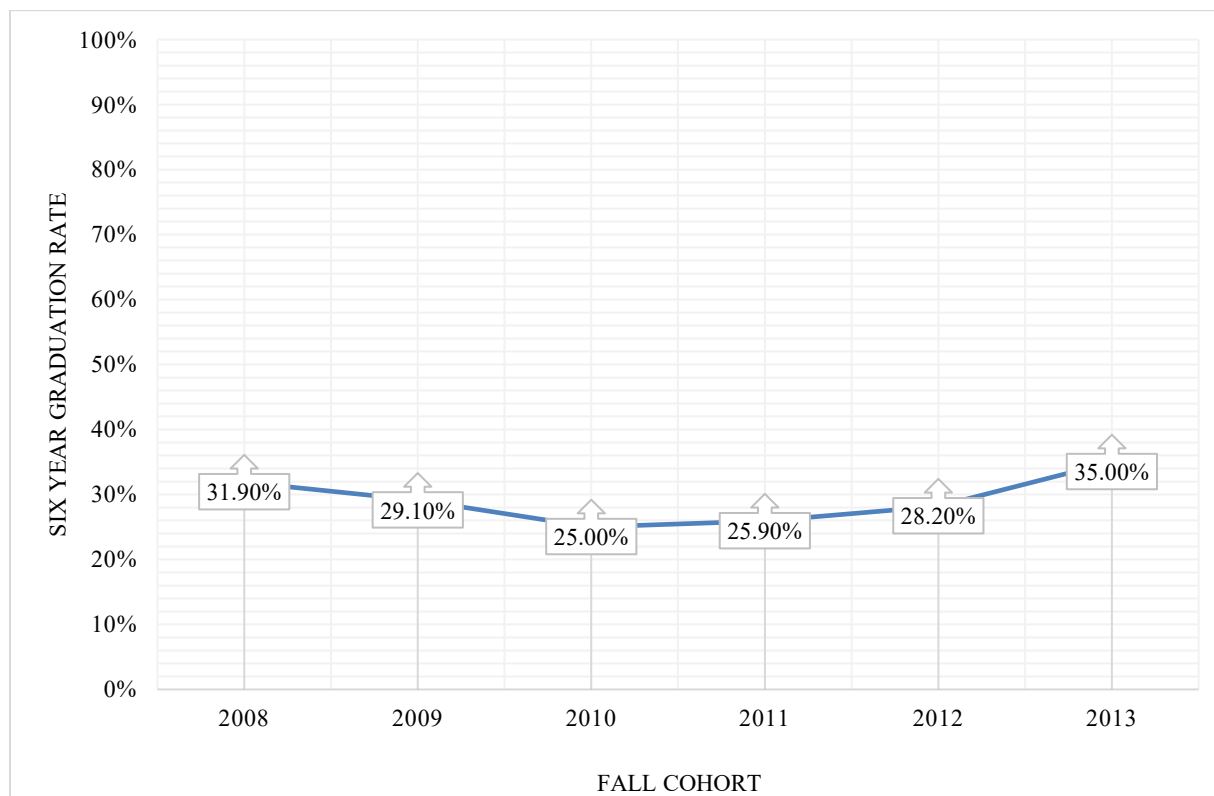
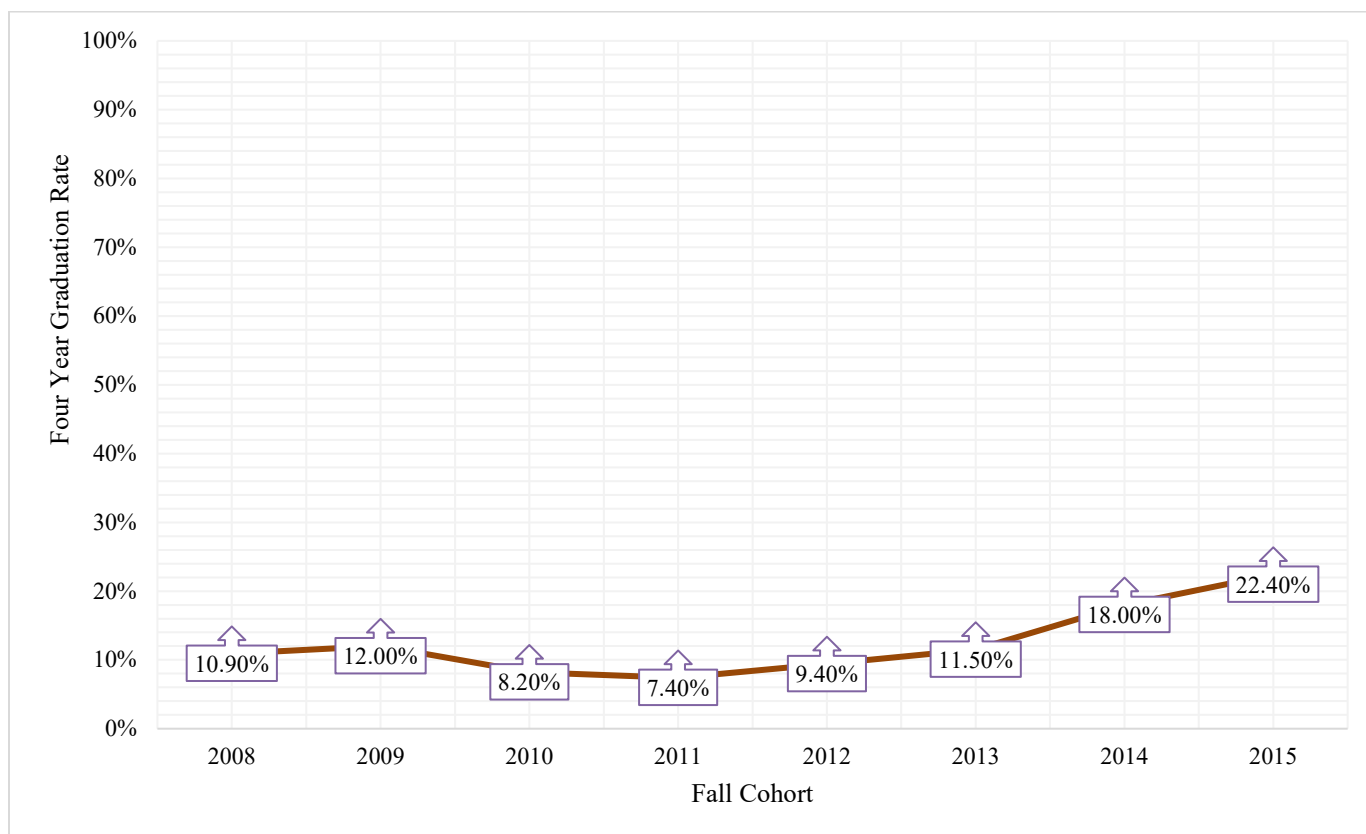

Figure 46: Trends in Institutional Retention Rate

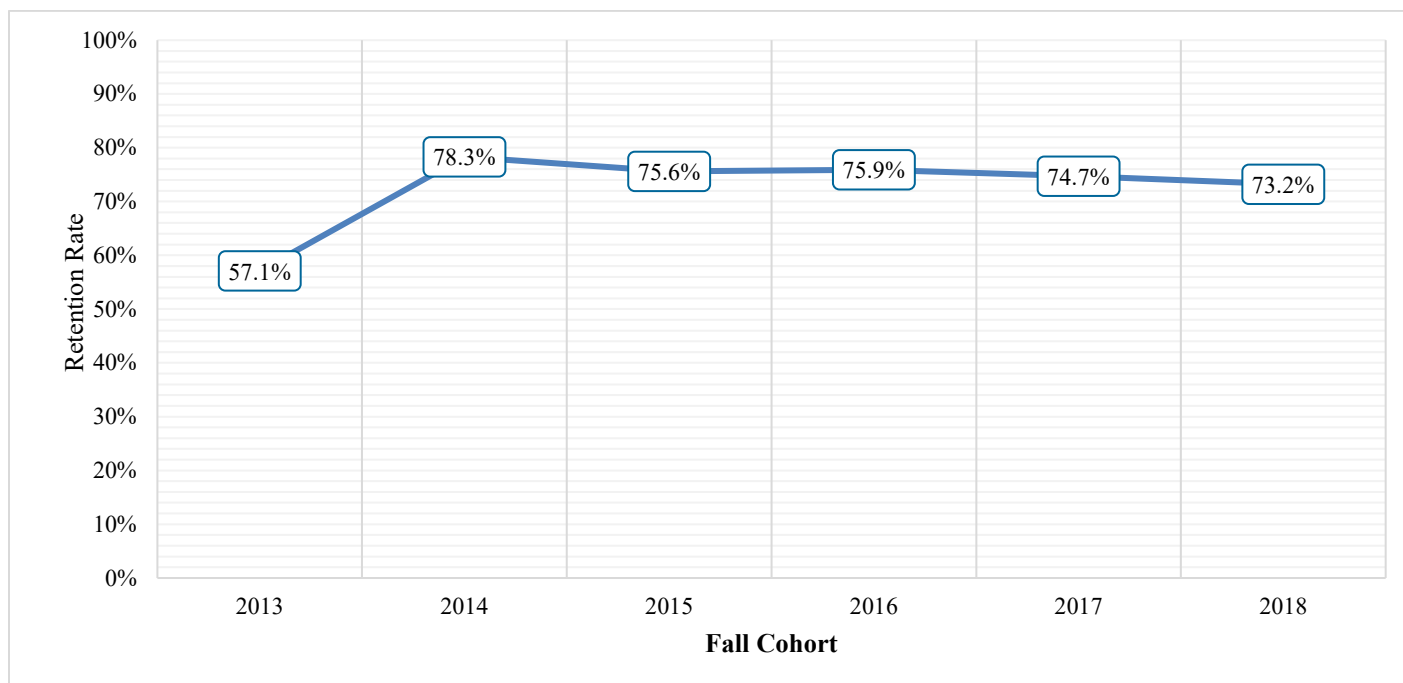

Figure 47: Fall 2019 Faculty and Staff by Gender

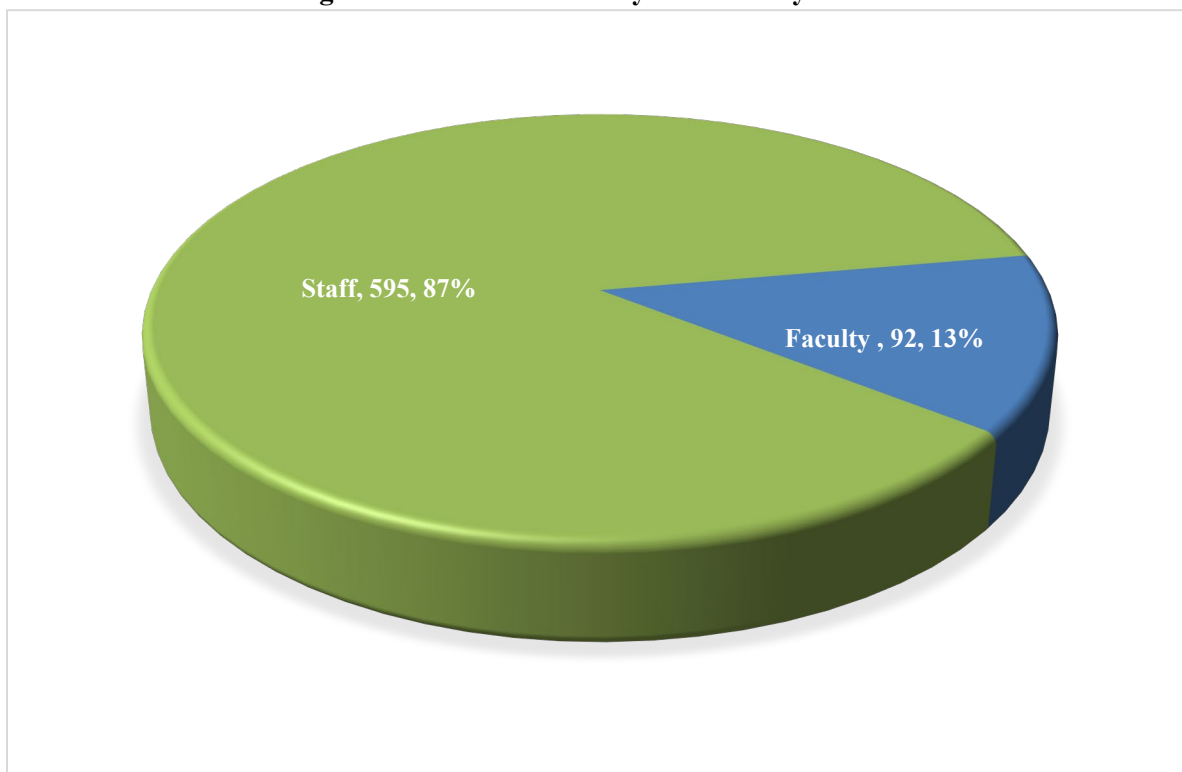

Figure 48: Fall 2019 Faculty by Academic Rank

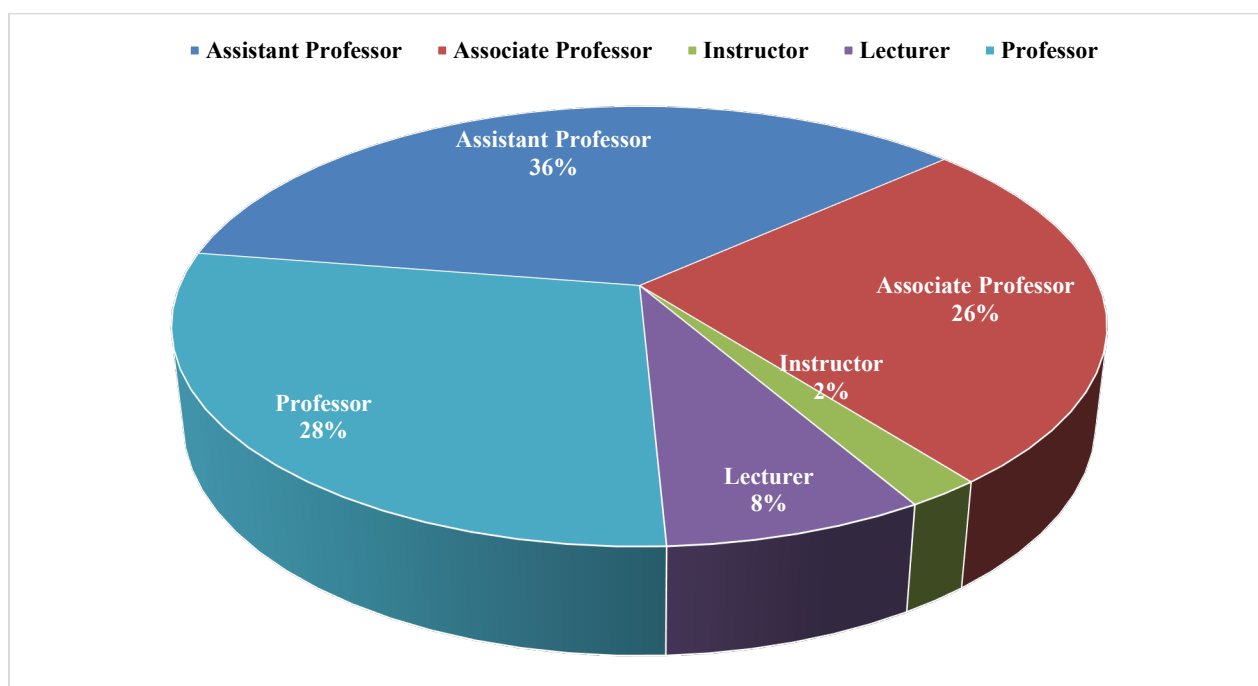

Figure 49: Fall 2019 Faculty by Race/Ethnicity

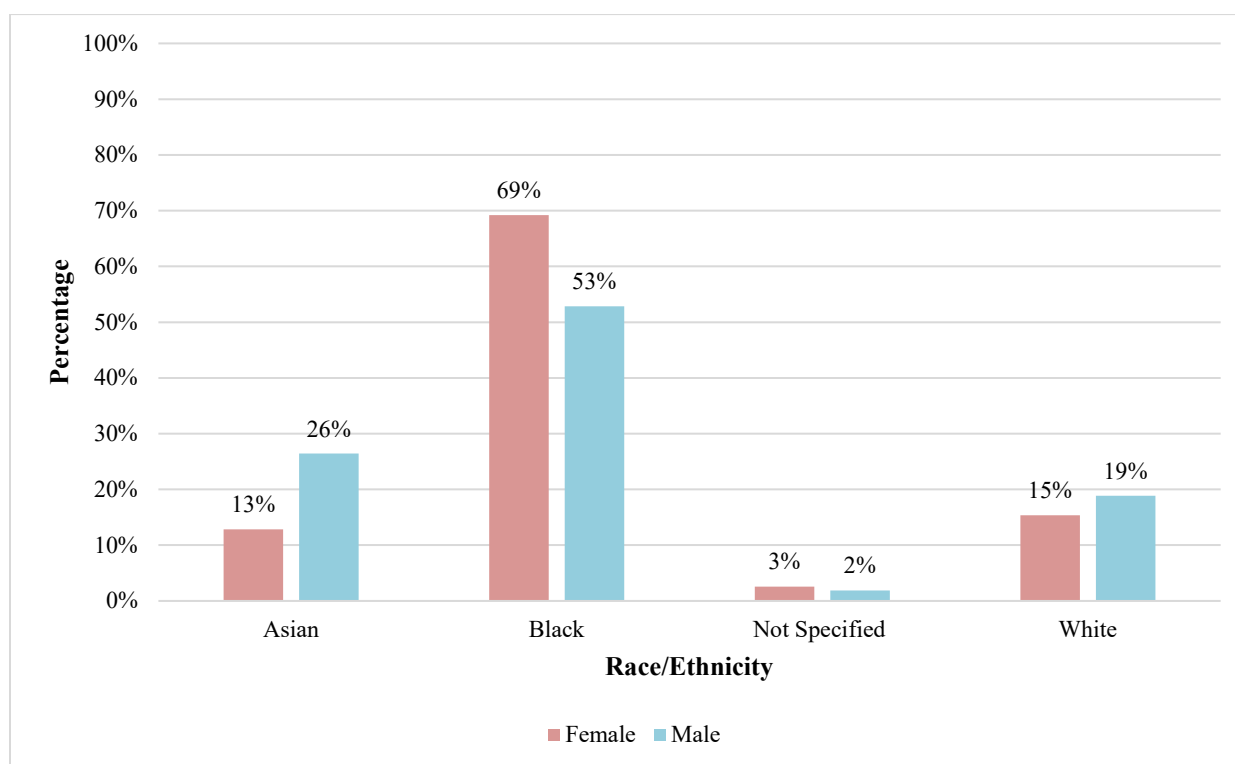
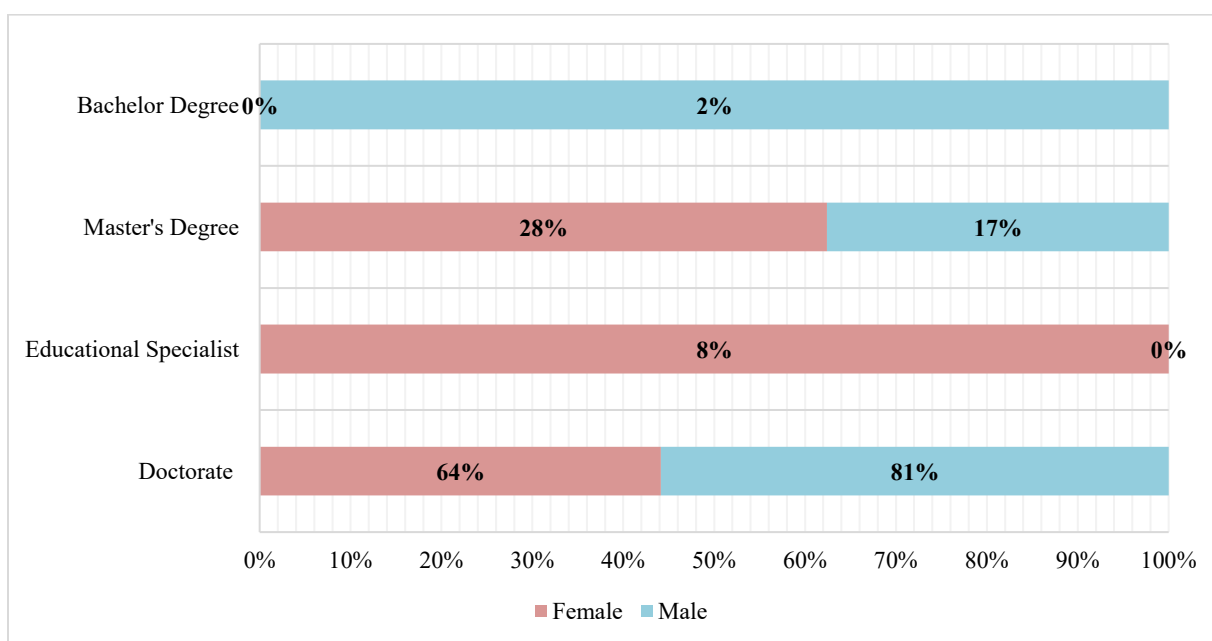
